What is a pregnancy exposure registry?

Pregnancy exposure registries are research studies that collect information about the effect that prescription medicines taken or vaccines received during pregnancy may have on pregnant people and their developing fetus.



Who can enroll in an exposure registry?

Pregnant patients who are exposed to certain medications or vaccinations may be able to enroll in a registry. The medication registries are updated on the FDA website: check out the QR code below!



Why would someone enroll?

Information from the registries are used to update safety information for medications and vaccines. This information contributes to the evidence base on medications in pregnancy.



What is your role as the clinician?

If your pregnant patients take certain medications or receive any vaccines with open registries, discuss the option of voluntary enrollment! Become knowledgeable about this process so you can be a resource for patients!



Check out the open registries!

Scan the QR code to see what registries are open and enrolling at this time! Registries maintain collected data in a secure manner & your patients' identities remain private.



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Why would I enroll in a registry?

Information from the registries help researchers know more about different medications. This research also helps providers who prescribe medications for pregnant and breastfeeding patients and their babies!



How do I get involved?

Check out the open registries using the link below or you can ask your clinician if you take any medications or receive any vaccinations that have an open registry.



What are the registry's expectations?

Different registries require different information from you. Be prepared to ask the following questions when signing up:

- *How often will I be contacted?*
- *How will you keep my information private?*
- *Who can I contact if I have questions?*
- *How do I find out the results of the study when the pregnancy exposure registry ends?*
- *Will the registry also want to collect information about my newborn baby?*



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
