Living with home parenteral and/or enteral nutrition (HPEN)

PN Product Shortages

As of early February, IV adult and pediatric multivitamins (sometimes referred to as MVI) were in short supply.* The American Society for Parenteral and Enteral Nutrition (ASPEN) has developed recommendations to help clinicians manage home parenteral nutrition (HPN) whenever IV product shortages such as this occur. These important recommendations are reviewed regularly, and are a great resource to share and discuss with your HPN team: www.nutrition-care.org/Guidelines_and_Clinical_Resources/Product_Shortages.

These recommendations include information that is critical for both short- and long-term HPN consumers, since there can be important health consequences if nutrients are missing from your PN. Ask your HPN clinician (nurse, dietitian, physician, etc.) and specifically your home infusion pharmacist to learn if you are affected by a shortage. If you are, ask if there is a plan in place to ensure you are getting what you need until the shortage is resolved.



Your home infusion pharmacist can help you better understand and become more familiar with ingredients that are listed on your HPN label. This may help you recognize if something looks different or is missing. If you do notice an unexpected change, contact the infusion pharmacist to review the bag's contents before infusing it.

Here are some ways you can advocate for yourself:

- Ask the infusion pharmacist to speak with you before any changes are made to your HPN, especially due to a nutrient or ingredient being on shortage.
- When any component such as multivitamins are on shortage, discuss the issue with your HPN clinician to ensure a plan is in place for an alternative method for getting vitamins (chewables or liquid vitamins perhaps) and for monitoring blood levels if necessary.

One of the most significant takeaways we found was the enormous challenge COVID-related isolation presented for consumers and caregivers. It was ranked the most challenging non-healthcare-related issue, and it affected the most respondents. Numerous respondents listed isolation and/or loneliness as an issue in other questions as well—including under healthcare-related challenges and quality of life issues, and as affecting the mental health status of the consumer and caregiver.

While we fully appreciate that nothing can take the place of in-person gatherings, we encourage members to reach out to Oley staff and one another via calling, texting, meeting virtually, and attending Oley meetings, support groups, and social events. (For details go to www.oley.org or Oley's Facebook page.) Q1. What are your biggest healthcare-related challenges due to COVID at this time? Rank 1 to 5, with one being the least problematic and 5 being the most problematic; or N/A if it's not a problem at all.

Note: The averages (\bar{x} =average) include only respondents (n=number) who consider the issue at least a little challenging. (N/A [not applicable] responses were not factored into the averages.) For example, twenty-one respondents found getting a visit with their primary care physician (PCP) challenging, but only mildly so; on a scale of 1 to 5, the average of the rankings among those twenty-one respondents was 2.09. The "summary of comments" presents prevalent themes among the respondents' comments, and the number of people who included that theme in their comments.

Isolation (n=16); fear of exposure (n=15); delayed doctor appointment/medical treatment (n=8); depression/mental health (n=8); supplies (n=8); no visitation policies (n=4); had COVID (n=3); other (n= ≤ 2): insurance, loss of job/income, multiple diagnoses/therapies, overworked healthcare system, trouble getting COVID testing, stress.

For example, 161 respondents found isolating themselves from friends and family to be very challenging; on a scale of 1 to 5, the average of the rankings among those 161 respondents was 3.88.
