Federal Election 2021 & Election Outcomes

- Promoted alternative-labour perspectives and priorities with political parties
- Produced in-depth analysis to members on major party platforms
- Raised PCA issues with federal candidates
- Held a well-attended post-election webinar assessing impacts for PCA members (and construction industry in general)

Improving Access to Skilled Workers Through Influencing Federal Policy

- Polled PCA members on labour needs for 2022
- Developed "Action Plan to Address the Acute Shortage of Workers in Construction and Infrastructure" policy plan
- Lobbied federal Liberal government Labour, Immigration and Industry -- to ease industry's shortage of skilled and semi-skilled workers through targeted policies
- Lobbied provincial governments to promote increased labour supply
