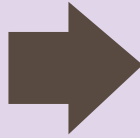


YOUTH SAFETY

HOWEVER

2010 statistics from BullyingStatistics.org may indicate that there may be under-reporting



1 in 7 students in the US K-12 has been bullied

The National Survey of Children's Exposure to Violence, 2010

an estimated

46 million

of the 76 million children residing in the U.S. are exposed to violence, crime, and abuse each year

~160,000

children in the US miss school each day out of fear of being bullied

5,000



14-24 year olds in Philadelphia county have been shot since 2007

The National Survey of Adolescents, 2003

4,000 adolescents ages 12-17



13% Females

3.4% Males

reported being sexually assaulted in their lifetime



13.4% Females

21.3% Males

reported experiencing physical assault in their lifetime



35% Females

43.6% Males

reported having witnessed violence in their lifetime

\$333 to \$750 billion

predicted annual incremental cost of violence and abuse on the national healthcare system, or

37.5 cents

of every dollar spent on healthcare

As many as **1 in 10** children in the U.S. are polyvictims of intimate partner violence, physical abuse, sexual abuse, and/or community violence



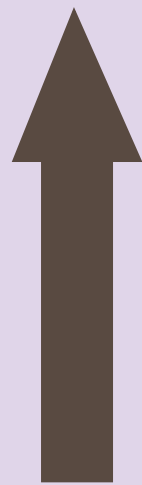
In the United States, we lose an average of

HOMICIDE as of 2008

Children ages 1-4

3rd leading cause of death

9% of deaths in the U.S., up from 2% in 1970

Children ages 5-14

4th leading cause of death

6% of deaths in the U.S., up from 2% in 1970
