- the letter-digit combination refers to the room
 - **all plenary sessions** will be held in *Göteborgs Konserthus*, the Gothenburg Concert Hall, located at Götaplatsen (**KH** in the program)
 - **all parallel sessions** will be held in the building of Gothenburg University's Faculty of Arts (*Humanistiska fakulteten*), just a five-minute walk from Götaplatsen at Renströmsgatan 6 (all other codes in the program)
- the final digit (1, 2, 3, 4) refers to the order of appearance within a time slot

This program contains four very different types of events:

- **Plenary lectures:** 45-minute presentations; speakers may fill up the entire period or choose to leave a little time for questions.
- **Lectures:** individual presentations following a strict format of 20 minutes + 5 to 10 minutes of discussion; lecture sessions typically contain 3 consecutive presentations; some of the sessions are still 'overbooked', but we expect a number of extra cancellations after the printing of this program so that this problem will be solved easily at the time of the conference; for 'underbooked' sessions with only two presentations, speakers are urged to stick to the format described so that participants know what is happening when.
- **Posters:** put up on poster boards on Thursday (all day) with a poster period in the afternoon during which there will be no competing events; authors are expected to be present at their poster during that period.
- **Panels:** pre-organized thematic events; the program gives an order in which presentations will be made, but the format may differ greatly from panel to panel (as also the number of speakers varies within given 90-minute time slots); participants are advised not to switch between panels, as this will most probably not get them what they are looking for anyway.
