D. HOW TO ENTER THE SHOW

You may enter the show one of three ways: (ONLINE ENTRIES ARE PREFERRED) ONLY FULL AND COMPLETE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED.

- 1. Hand Written and Snail Mail: Print and include all entry packet requirements as outlined in Section F below. With this method the office fee is \$35.
- 2. Total Online Application: Through www.foxvillage.com and follow the instructions to enter the show, submit the Coggins and other documents, and make your payment. Fox Village will forward your entry, payment, and all other documents to PVDA. Fox Village includes a 5% transaction fee. With this method, the office fee is \$35.
- 3. IMPORTANT: You MUST include the brand new USEF forms included in this prizelist. CREDIT CARDS not accepted at show. Cash, checks, or PayPal only.

 No telephone, fax, or email entries will be accepted. Do not send entry packets via registered, certified, or signature-required mail.

E. SHOW FACILITY RULES AND INFORMATION

- Dogs: Must be leashed while on show grounds and in stable area. No dogs in the office areas; violations will result in a fine to owners.
- Gray Water: Do not dump gray water (waste water) on the show ground.
- Smoking: Smoking is not permitted within 100 feet of the barns or in/near the show office.
- Food: Food will be available for purchase on the show grounds.
- · Competition Arenas: Three or four 20x60m outdoor arenas with all weather footing
- Warm up areas: One 200' x 550' outdoor arena with all weather footing.
- · Lungeing Area: One 200' x 220' outdoor arena with all weather footing. Lunging is permitted in designated arena only.

F. ENTRY PACKET REQUIREMENTS

- 1. Entry Form: Entries must be submitted online or on a 2024 Licensed Entry Form (attached). Entries will be accepted only with the entry form and payment. The Owner, Rider, and Trainer (and Coach, if applicable) boxes on page two must ALL have ORIGINAL SIGNATURES (no "same".) For Test of Choice (TOC) classes the test must be indicated on page 1 of the form.
- 2. Payment: Each entry must have its own separate check, made payable to PVDA or payment online. Fees must be paid in full with the entry form. If a check for entry fees is returned by the bank, the entry will be placed on a waiting list until all fees are paid in cash, money order, or cashier's check. All returned checks are subject to a \$30 service fee. Pas de Deux: each rider pays 1/2 of class fee. Quadrille: each rider pays 1/4 of class fee.
- 3. New USEF Release Form: Each person (owner, rider, trainer, and coach if applicable must sign a separate form. (Attached to this prizelist or at USEF.org)
- **4. New USEF Federation Entry Agreement:** One form per entry with a separate signature for rider, owner/agent, trainer, and coach if applicable, even if they are same person. (Attached to this prizelist or available at <u>USEF.org</u>)
- 5. Coggins Certificate: Entries without proof of a negative Coggins test valid throughout the show date will not be accepted. If a new Coggins test is pending, the new certificate must be submitted to the show secretary before the horse can enter the show ground. Email of a scanned certificate is acceptable. The Coggins certificate must state the horse's name as it appears on the entry blank (USEF Rule GR 907.3)
- 6. USEF/USDF Horse Recording/Registration and Owner/Rider/Trainer/Coach Memberships: Use the USEF Affiliates Membership Verification Service at www.eqverifcation.org to provide proof of horse USEF/USDF recording/registration, owner and rider USEF/USDF memberships, and trainer USEF membership.

 **USEF Horse Recording and USDF Horse Registration:* Proof required for USDF-GAIG regional championship qualifying classes. USDF Horse Identification Number (HID) required, as a minimum, for non-qualifying classes. Proof must be provided with the entry form.
- **USDF Membership:** USDF members must provide proof of current membership with the entry form. If current USDF member cannot show proof of membership, they should fill out the affidavit and pay the \$5 fee. If rider and/or owner are not current USDF members, a \$35 USDF non-member fee/show must be paid with the entry form along with the affidavit and \$5 fee. If a rider and/or owner previously paid a non-membership fee and cannot provide the non-membership number, in addition to the \$35 non-member fee, a \$5 affidavit fee will be assessed.
- •USEF Exemptions: Horses and people involved only in Introductory, Opportunity, Pas de Deux and/or Quadrille classes are exempt from USEF horse recording requirements and USEF membership requirements.
- •USDF Exemptions: Horses and people involved only in Introductory, OpportunityPas de Deux and/or Quadrille classes are exempt from USDF horse registration requirements and USDF membership requirements.
- 7. Proof of Rider/Owner/Trainer Safe Sport Training: Applies to USEF members age 18 and over. The proof should appear on the USEF verification, if it does not, submit a certification of training.
- 8. Proof of Current Vaccination: USEF GR845. Must have horse name the same as on the show entry.
- 9. Freestyle Test: Per USEF Rule DR129.9: "Except for USEF/USDF Championship classes and for FEI Pony Riders, FEI Junior and FEI Young Rider Freestyles, in order to enter a freestyle class at any level, a horse/rider combination must have received a minimum score of 63% for Training through Fourth levels and 60% for FEI levels in the highest test of the declared freestyle level or any test of a higher level at a Federation /USDF Licensed Dressage Competition or FEI recognized Dressage Competition or "open" Dressage class (i.e. open to all breeds) at a Federation Licensed Competition held prior to the competition where the horse/rider combination is entered to ride a freestyle class. To enter an FEI Para Dressage Freestyle class, a horse/rider combination must have received a minimum score of 60% in any FEI Para Dressage test (Para Novice Test, Para Intermediate Test or Para Grand Prix Test) at the rider's classified Grade. This score may be earned at a USEF/USDF licensed Dressage Competition or FEI recognized Dressage Competition or "open" Dressage class (i.e. open to all breeds) at a Federation Licensed Competition held prior to the competition where the horse/rider combination is entered to ride a freestyle class. A photocopy of the test verifying eligibility, or copy of the USDF score verification, must be submitted with the entry for a freestyle class. All FEI Pony Rider Tests are equivalent to Second Level; all FEI Junior Tests are equivalent to Third Level; all FEI Young Rider Tests are equivalent to PSG; and the USEF Brentina Cup (Young Adult) Test and FEI Young Rider Grand Prix 16-25 Tests are equivalent to Intermediate II. For purposes of freestyle qualification, all are considered equivalent to the highest test of that level and may be used to enter a freestyle at that level or a level below. Young Horse and FEI Children Tests cannot be used for freestyle qualification at any level. For verification, access http://www.usdf.org/usdfscores
- 10. MPA Disclosure: If a horse has received medroxyprogesterone acetate (MPA), commonly known as the human product Depo-Provera® within 90 days and is competing at a USEF licensed competition an MPA Disclosure Form must be completed. https://www.usef.org/forms-pubs/pZXMbDmczlw/medroxyprogesterone-acetate-mpa
- 11. Other Documents: Anyone with a Presidential modification, dispensation or classification certificate must submit that documentation with their entry.
- 12. Vesicular Stomatitis: We will not be accepting any entries from Vesicular Stomatitis affected states.

G. OTHER ENTRY REQUIREMENTS AND INFORMATION

- Snail Mailed Entries: Mail entry packets to the show secretary. Do not send entry packets via registered, certified, or signature-required mail. No telephone, fax, or email entries will be accepted.
- · Grounds Fee: A \$30 per day grounds fee must be paid for horses that are not stabled during the show.
- Non-Competing Horses: Must be registered with the Show Secretary. The owner/representative must provide copy of a current Coggins test report, pay the office fee, and pay either a stabling fee or daily grounds fee(s). The owner/representative of non-competing horses does not pay the USEF Drug/Medication fee. Non-competing horses must wear a bridle number at all times when they are not trailered or stabled.
- Test Versions: Current editions of the USEF tests for Training Level through Fourth Level will be used. Current editions of the USDF Introductory Level, Quadrille and Pas de Deux tests and current editions of the FEI Prix St. Georges, Intermediate I, II, A and B, and Grand Prix tests will be used. Copies of the tests may be obtained from the governing body website for each organization.
- Limited Entries: Entries may be limited if the show is over-subscribed. Entries received after the show is full will be placed on a waiting list. The show may fill prior to the closing date.
- On-time and Late Entries: On-time entries must be received by the Entry Secretary on or before the closing date. Entries received after the closing date will be accepted on a space available basis. Entries received after the closing date may be charged a \$50 post entry surcharge.
- · Acknowledgement of Entry Receipt: Will be emailed to each rider. Please check for errors, notify the secretary immediately if errors exist.
- Ride Times: will be available on the website www.pvda.org approximately one week before the show date.
- Horse Substitutions: Riders may substitute horses once they have entered only upon presentation of a vet certificate for the incapacitated horse, or a bill-of-sale, and only in the same classes in which the first horse was entered. The secretary must be notified at least 24 hours before the class(es) take place and a new entry form must be completed and submitted, along with a copy of a current Coggins for the new horse.
- Refunds: No refund for overpayment of \$10 or less. For scratches prior to the closing date, entry fees will be refunded less a \$35 office fee. After the closing date, no refunds (including stabling fees and overpayments) will be issued for any reason, including rider and/or horse health/injury, Acts of God, inclement weather, terrorism, or other emergencies.

H. OTHER SHOW RULES AND INFORMATION

- USEF Rules: EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT USEF RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH.
- Vaccination Requirements: Effective 12/01/2015, Horses entering the show grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within 6 months prior to entering the show grounds. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the grounds upon request by Competition Management (GR845)
- Show Management Rights: Show Management reserves the right to refuse entries (USEF Rule V) and to make changes, deletions, or corrections, as deemed necessary.
- Class and Judge Changes: Management reserves the right to split, combine, delete, or add classes. Management also reserves the right to add or substitute judges or make any changes required by circumstances.
- Veterinarian, Farrier, and EMT: A farrier and EMT will be on the grounds during the show and on call after show hours. A veterinarian will be on call for the duration of the show. All emergency numbers will be posted in the Secretary's Office and the barns.
- · Bridle Numbers: Bridle numbers must be worn at all times when a horse is being hand-walked, exercised, or ridden.
- Freestyle CDs: Riders competing in freestyle classes must present a good quality CD at least two hours prior to their scheduled ride time.
- No-shows: If a competitor fails to notify the competition secretary of his/her intention to scratch a test (i.e., is a "no show"), competition management reserves the right to fill all of that competitor's subsequent ride times (USEF Rule DR 126.3).
- Damages to Third Parties: All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents, or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events.
- Sharps Containers: Each barn has one sharps container per 50 horses available (per GR 1210.4). Show Management may fine any individual, including trainers, exhibitors, owners, or their agents, up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments.
- Show Office/Schooling Hours: Friday before the show 12pm to 6:30 pm; Saturday 7am until one hour after the show ends.
- Safe Sport: Reminder: All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. More information about these can be found at www.usef.org.
- · Pony Measurement: If you need a pony measured you must notify show manager 10 days prior to the show. Measurements will be held at 11am on Saturday.
- · Headgear: See Section U

I. STABLING

- 118 10' x 12' permanent stalls are available on a first-come, first-served basis. Stalls have permanent, sliding doors. NO SCREW EYES ALLOWED!
- If necessary stalls may be restricted to competing horses whose entries are received by the closing date.
- Horse and tack stalls are \$135 per weekend (12pm on Friday through 7pm on Sunday). Day stalls (6am to 6pm) are \$70 per day. Use of tack stalls may be limited.
- Initial bedding is not provided. Bedding may be pre-ordered with the entry at \$12/bag delivered to your stall. Additional bedding will be available at the show.
- \$50 muck fee per stall (including tack stall) required in separate check payable to Loch Moy Farm. Once cleaned and stripped see barn manager, once approved she will give you a slip of paper to take to the show office for a return of your muck fee.
- · Stall assignments will be posted on the PVDA web site for horses whose current Coggins has been submitted.
- · Riders must provide emergency contact information on their entry form and on the stall card.

- Class Awards: Award and six ribbons in each class. Management reserves the right to combine and split classes.

M. PVDA HOLD HARMLESS CLAUSE

Understanding that horse sports may be hazardous and dangerous, even leading to permanent injury or death, each owner, rider, spectator, and other participant assumes any and all risk of loss or injury and agrees to hold harmless, regardless of negligent acts or omissions, the Potomac Valley Dressage Association, Inc., organizer, show committee, and all horse show personnel.

N. USEF MOTOR VEHICLE STATEMENT

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

USDF Statement on Animal Welfare

The United States Dressage Federation, Inc. (USDF), a federation of over 100 independent organizations throughout the United States with a member-ship of nearly 30,000 members, supports the concept of ethical treatment of animals.

Dressage is a classical method of training horses, based upon the horse's natural responses, as carried out in a gradual, planned program during which the horse's athletic abilities are improved in a systematic manner. As a result, the horse becomes capable, comfortable, and responsive in partnership with the rider without the use of force. Dressage competition at various levels of achievement is the ultimate test of the training program to determine whether the desired harmony between horse and rider has been achieved.

The rules pertaining to dressage competition prohibit the use of artificial appliances, training aids, and drugs, which would force the horse to submit. Instead, the emphasis is upon training and a cooperative partnership with the rider. Major competitions are carefully monitored to assure that there is no unnecessary force or harshness displayed.

Unlike other horse sports in which horses enter training at a relatively immature state, dressage training is usually not seriously begun until the horse is three or four. The top levels of achievement require five or more years of progressive training and it is not unusual to see horses in international competition in their late teens. This, in itself, places a premium on good care and soundness throughout the horse's life.

While supporting the concept of animal welfare in its broadest form, the United States Dressage Federation, Inc., also recognizes that it is unrealistic to ascribe human emotions and responses to the horse which in its wild state is a creature of flight, living a hard and precarious existence. Under domestication, the horse is assured of ample food, water, and shelter, as well as protection against infectious diseases and damaging parasites, thus leading a longer and healthier life with a high rate of survival.

As an educational organization, USDF has numerous programs, which teach people how to pursue the accepted, humane training methods. A program of certifying instructors also emphasizes protecting the horse's welfare in pursuit of dressage training.

A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, or agent, at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes

R. USDF ATTENTION COMPETITORS

Each competitor is responsible for supplying management with correct association numbers (United States Dressage Federation, United States Equestrian Federation) for horse, owner, rider, and trainer before the day(s) of the competition. The scores of competitors who fail to supply correct numbers may not be counted toward national.

<u>USDF Membership Benefits:</u> USDF is dedicated to education, the recognition of achievement, and promotion of dressage. For details on member benefits, including educational programs, awards, and other opportunities, refer to the *USDF Member Guide* or the USDF website at www.usdf.org.

Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions:

Owners and riders, including foreign riders

and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership (GM), Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF Non-Member (NM) fee. (Note: USDF Business Members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF Business Membership.)

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those
 sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at
 Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, pas de deux or quadrille, are
 exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot,
 academy, and opportunity classes.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM
 identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

Memberships Defined

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$90), 5-years (\$360), or life (\$1,800). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21st birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$72). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards Program and the USDF Regional Schooling Show Awards Program. **Business Membership (BM):** A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$240) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$35 per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF, along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee and Competition Affidavit Form if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF PM, GM, or BM there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post-competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF website.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$35). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded but will NOT be counted towards Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$80. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$115) is eligible for Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.

How to Join USDF

Applications for USDF Participating Membership (PM), Business Membership (BM), Horse Identification (HID) number, and Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) may be found in the following locations:

- On the USDF website: www.usdf.org. You can submit the application online or download the form.
- In the show office at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions classified by USEF as Dressage Competitions, and Regular Competitions which are open to all breeds.

The effective date of membership is the date the form and correct fees are received in the USDF office or, if applying at a competition, the date accepted by the competition secretary, provided the application is signed and dated by the competition secretary, member, and/or horse owner on that same day.

U. USEF HEADGEAR RULE

Protective headgear is defined as a riding helmet, which meets or exceeds current ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. From the time horses are officially admitted to the competition grounds by competition management, anyone mounted on a horse at any time on the competition grounds, including non-competing riders, riders on non-competing horses, mounted participants in exhibition classes, and those competing in all classes and tests, including Para Dressage tests, must wear protective headgear as defined by this rule and otherwise in compliance with GR801. The harness must be secured and properly fitted. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until the headgear is properly in place. Protective headgear may be the same as or a coordinating color with the coat, and may include contrast coloring, accent, and crystal decoration. See DR136 for dress code rules for exhibitions

USEF SHOW PASS FAQS - EFFECTIVE 12/1/2022

Q. Currently riders competing in Academy, Walk-Trot, and Opportunity classes are exempt from USEF membership. Will these exemptions remain in place in 2023?

A. Yes, any classes or sections that are currently exempt from membership will continue to be exempt.

Q. Will the online show pass system at USEF communicate with show management software systems?

A. Yes, the USEF Show Pass information will be available live, in real time through the USEF API to show management software.

Q. Will the USEF API indicate whether someone is ineligible for a Show Pass if they have already paid for one for that year?

A. Yes, the USEF API will return information that the person is ineligible.

Q. Are riders, owners, and trainers all eligible for one Show Pass per competition year?

A. No. While riders and owners are eligible for one Show Pass, trainers and coaches are no longer eligible to participate under a Show Pass and must be an Active USEF member.

Q. Are parents that sign as the trainer or coach for their minor child exempt from membership and/or show pass?

A. No, anyone that signs an entry blank or acts as a trainer or coach must be an Active USEF member and is not eligible for a Show Pass.

Q. Are foreign competitors (citizens of other nations) with proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation required to pay a Show Pass?

A. No, non-US citizens who are members in good standing of their National Federations with proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation are exempt from payment of the Federation Show Pass fee.

Q. Can a competition accept payment from an exhibitor for a Show Pass fee?

A. No, Show Pass purchases can only be made online by exhibitors.

Q. If I purchase one Show Pass, is it good for the whole competition year?

A. No, a Show Pass is only valid for <u>one competition</u> and non-member participants (riders, drivers, handlers, vaulters, longeurs, owners, lessees, and agents) are limited to obtaining no more than one (1) Show Pass per competition year.
