

Criteria for IARR support of meetings other than the International Congress of Radiation Research

The meeting should be international and a major part of the scientific programme should be concerned with research into the effects of ionising radiation. The meeting should have no restriction on attendance by any member countries of the IARR and should be likely to be attended by scientists from such countries. Meetings organised by the national societies comprising the IARR are ineligible.

Finance Support

The sum agreed by the Council of the IARR should be regarded as a loan and may be used by the organiser of the meeting for any legitimate purpose in its organisation. The organiser should undertake, however, to devote a sum equal to, or greater than, that provided by the IARR towards assisting younger scientists to attend the meeting and to provide the IARR with a copy of the meeting's accounts. In the event that the meeting has a financial surplus, organisers are requested to return as much as possible of the money advanced by the IARR so that it can be used in assisting other meetings.

The purpose of these conditions is (i) to give organisers as much freedom as possible in organising the meeting, (ii) to ensure that some money will be available to defray the costs of younger scientists attending, and (iii) that surplus monies can be used for the same purpose.
