SSVE SECTION UPDATE

Legislative/Governmental Affairs Update

Dr. Michelle Aliff and Ryann Hill recently met with SSA leadership including Jay Ortis (Acting Deputy Commissioner for Disability Adjudication) and Acting Chief ALJ to discuss efforts to improve disability determinations.

Key Takeaways:

- DDS Delays: SSA acknowledged long wait times and is exploring tech-based solutions to streamline case processing and flag idle cases.
- Vocational Experts (VEs): SSA reaffirmed the essential role of VEs at the hearing level and emphasized that

human adjudicators will continue to make final decisions.

- Occupational Data: Concerns were raised about the limitations of the Occupational Requirements Survey (ORS), including its lack of data on issues like cane use, absenteeism, and full-time work. SSA agreed ORS should not be the sole occupational data source.
- ALJ Expectations & DOT: Some ALJs still expect VE testimony to align with the outdated DOT. SSA recognized the need to resolve this inconsistency as part of modernization efforts.

SSA Modernization Efforts: What's on the Horizon for VEs?

SSA is revisiting proposed regulations that threatens utilization of vocational experts (VEs) by replacing the DOT with ORS data and relying on internal software (VIT) to determine job availability and potentially allowing ALJ's to input RFCs without expert input. These changes, originally drafted but never released under the prior administration, may soon be issued as a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking. If the NPRM is issued, a public comment period will follow. This will be a critical opportunity to advocate for the continued role of vocational experts and ensure that decision-making remains grounded in expert analysis and not just algorithms.

Also on Our Radar:

The recent removal of Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) Commissioner Erika McEntarfer has raised new concerns about the stability and reliability of labor market data used by SSA and VEs. We are watching this closely for potential downstream effects.

Finally, we're excited to introduce the 2025-2026 Social Security Vocational Expert (SSVE) Section Board and look forward to another strong year of collaboration, advocacy, and professional growth.

The 2025 Life Care Planning Summit, held in Minneapolis, Minnesota, May 16 and 17, 2025 convened over 100 interdisciplinary professionals to collaboratively shape the future of life care planning through consensus building and critical review of foundational practices. This biennial event focused on evaluating and refining the Consensus and Majority Statements that guide ethical, methodological, and professional standards in the field. Utilizing methodologies such as the Nominal Group Technique and real-time voting via Mentimeter software, participants analyzed 96 existing statements, leading to their reclassification into five distinct categories:

- Relevant to the Life Care Planner
- Relevant to the Life Care Planner- also Published Elsewhere
- Advisory to Life Care Planning Educational Programs, Certifying Bodies, Professional Associations and Organizations
- Under Further Review
- Previously Deleted, and now Historically Irrelevant or No Longer Valid.

In addition to consensus work, the Summit included breakout sessions addressing the current landscape of educational programs, certifications, and professional associations, identifying key strengths, challenges, and areas for future development. Attendee demographics revealed a broad representation across disciplines, geographies, and experience levels, reflecting the field's diversity. The collective insights reaffirmed our commitment to maintaining reliable, defensible, and client-centered Life Care Plans. The 2025 Summit outcomes serve as a renewed call for all practicing life care planners to remain actively engaged in shaping our profession and preserving its core values while evolving to meet emerging challenges.

The venue, The MacNamara Alumni Center, was exciting and fresh. Participants enjoyed the beautiful campus of University of Minnesota and the accommodations were very nice.
