To enable insights through bringing disciplines and stakeholders together



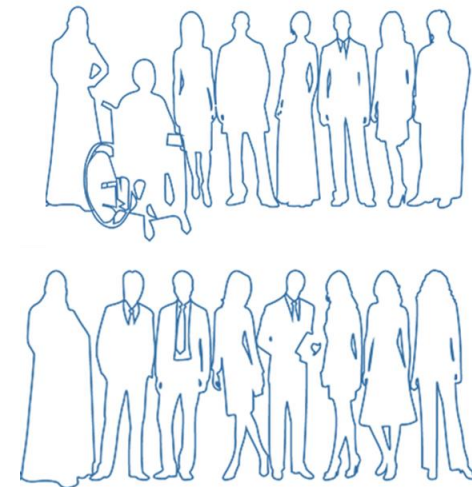
2. Professional Body

To enable insights through bringing disciplines together for a more navigable world



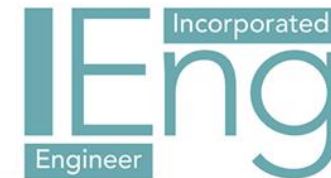
- By partnering with industry, academia, professional practitioners and other learned societies
