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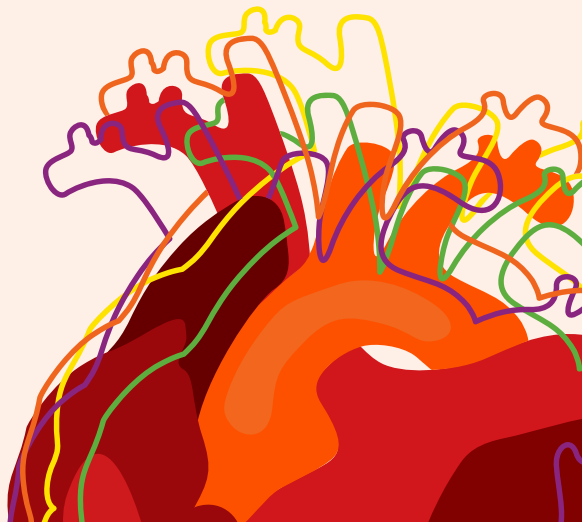

2026 SCCT GOLD MEDAL AWARD FOR DISTINGUISHED SERVICE

ED NICOL, MD, MBA, MSCCT

Professor of Cardiovascular Imaging at King's College, London
Consultant, Royal Brompton and Chelsea & Westminster Hospitals
Wing Commander, RAF Consultant Cardiologist



This medal recognizes Dr. Nicol's exemplary leadership of SCCT, as displayed throughout his nearly two decades of membership in the Society and particularly during his 10 years of service on the Board of Directors. A past president (2023–2024), Dr. Nicol is a key role and influence on SCCT education, serving in over 75 chair and speaking roles in the past 8 years, as well as on the JCCT Editorial Board.

During his leadership of the Education Committee (2018–2021), SCCT implemented a new task force structure that has provided pathways for dozens of SCCT members to engage in meaningful ways in planning and delivering the Society's in-person, on-demand and live virtual education, which was especially valuable during the COVID pandemic.

2026 SCCT ARTHUR S. AGATSTON CARDIOVASCULAR DISEASE PREVENTION AWARD

MICHAEL SHAPIRO, DO, MCR, FSCCT

Professor of Cardiovascular Medicine

SCCT selected Dr. Shapiro for this award in recognition of his dedication to advancing the understanding and management of atherosclerotic cardiovascular disease, with particular emphasis on lipid disorders and early detection of risk. Through his influential body of research, he has helped illuminate the complex relationships between lipoproteins, inflammation and cardiovascular risk, translating scientific discovery into practical strategies for prevention. His work has contributed to the growing integration of advanced cardiovascular imaging with lipid management, helping clinicians better identify high-risk individuals and tailor therapies to prevent future events.

In addition to his scientific achievements, the award recognizes Dr. Shapiro's work as an educator and mentor who has trained and inspired the next generation of clinicians and investigators in preventive cardiology. His commitment to multidisciplinary collaboration has strengthened the role of imaging and prevention in contemporary cardiovascular care.

2026 SCCT STEPHAN ACHENBACH PIONEER AWARD IN CARDIOVASCULAR CT

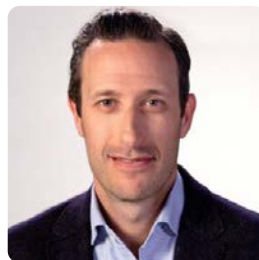
JONATHON LEIPSIC, MD, FRCPC, MSCCT

SCCT is honoring Dr. Leipsic for his extensive contributions over the past two decades as a transformative leader in the development and clinical integration of cardiac CT. His work has helped establish CCTA as an essential tool for the diagnosis of coronary artery disease, structural heart planning and the evaluation of complex cardiovascular conditions.

Dr. Leipsic's work has been instrumental in advancing the use of cardiac CT for procedural planning and risk assessment in TAVR and TMVR. His contributions have significantly improved procedural safety and outcomes, shaping global standards in the rapidly evolving field of structural heart disease intervention.

A past president of SCCT and the recipient of the Gold Medal Award in 2019, Dr. Leipsic is also recognized as a committed mentor, supporting the work and careers of numerous clinicians and imagers.

2026 CHINNAIYAN CATALYST AWARD FOR WOMEN'S CARDIOVASCULAR HEALTH RESEARCH

Principally supported by Kavitha Chinnaiyan, MD, MSCCT and Arul Chinnaiyan, MD, PhD, this award aims to provide recognition, visibility and seed funding for research projects that highlight and improve gaps in our understanding of cardiac and vascular physiology, specifically in women, incorporating CCTA imaging.

Dr. Avivi's winning submission, "Beyond Calcium: Coronary Plaque Characterization in Postmenopausal Women on Hormone Replacement Therapy," aims to use CCTA to characterize coronary plaque in postmenopausal women on hormone replacement therapy (HRT), comparing findings with propensity-matched women not receiving HRT and evaluating associations with treatment duration and long-term cardiovascular outcomes. By moving beyond CAC scoring alone, the project aims to determine whether HRT is associated with lower plaque burden and less obstructive disease while identifying potentially high-risk non-calcified plaque that CAC may miss, advancing mechanistic understanding of cardiovascular risk and prevention in menopausal women.

STATEMENT OF NEED

Cardiovascular disease is the leading cause of death in the United States and imposes an ever increasing burden on healthcare systems. Rapidly changing technology and the criteria for its use continue to be at the forefront in the diagnosis and treatment of patients presenting with possible cardiovascular disease. Due to advancing technologies in cardiovascular imaging, it is essential that we close the knowledge, competence and performance gaps by bringing together experts in the field to provide peer-to-peer education and interactive discussion through case-based, didactic and interactive sessions. Cardiologists, radiologists, technologists and other clinicians with an interest in cardiovascular disease will benefit from the varied formats at SCCT2026. SCCT has designed the SCCT2026 — the 21st Annual Scientific Meeting to address and narrow the practice gaps of its members.

OVERVIEW AND OBJECTIVES

The SCCT2026 Annual Scientific Meeting is designed to engage physicians and healthcare professionals interpreting cardiovascular CT in a comprehensive exploration of the most current developments in the field of cardiovascular CT principles, methodologies, appropriateness criteria and clinical practice.

Didactic lectures, image-based case examples and research in cardiovascular CT are designed to increase the competence and performance of the physician and technologist performing and interpreting cardiovascular CT. The Annual Scientific Meeting will focus on the technological advances, as well as the potential applications and limitations of cardiovascular CT.

AT THE CONCLUSION OF THE MEETING, PARTICIPANTS SHOULD BE BETTER ABLE TO:

- Discuss with colleagues the parameters which result in maximum image quality while minimizing radiation exposure during cardiovascular CT.
- Identify potential common image artifacts which contribute to inappropriate analysis of cardiovascular CT scans.
- Determine when an alternative imaging method would improve the diagnosis of a specific cardiovascular anomaly.
- Critically evaluate those data which indicate potential applications of cardiovascular CT in other patient studies.
- Evaluate the emerging research in cardiovascular CT to determine its possible role in changing the current evidence-based protocols or stimulating additional research.
- Discuss the appropriate use of cardiovascular CT with colleagues and patients.

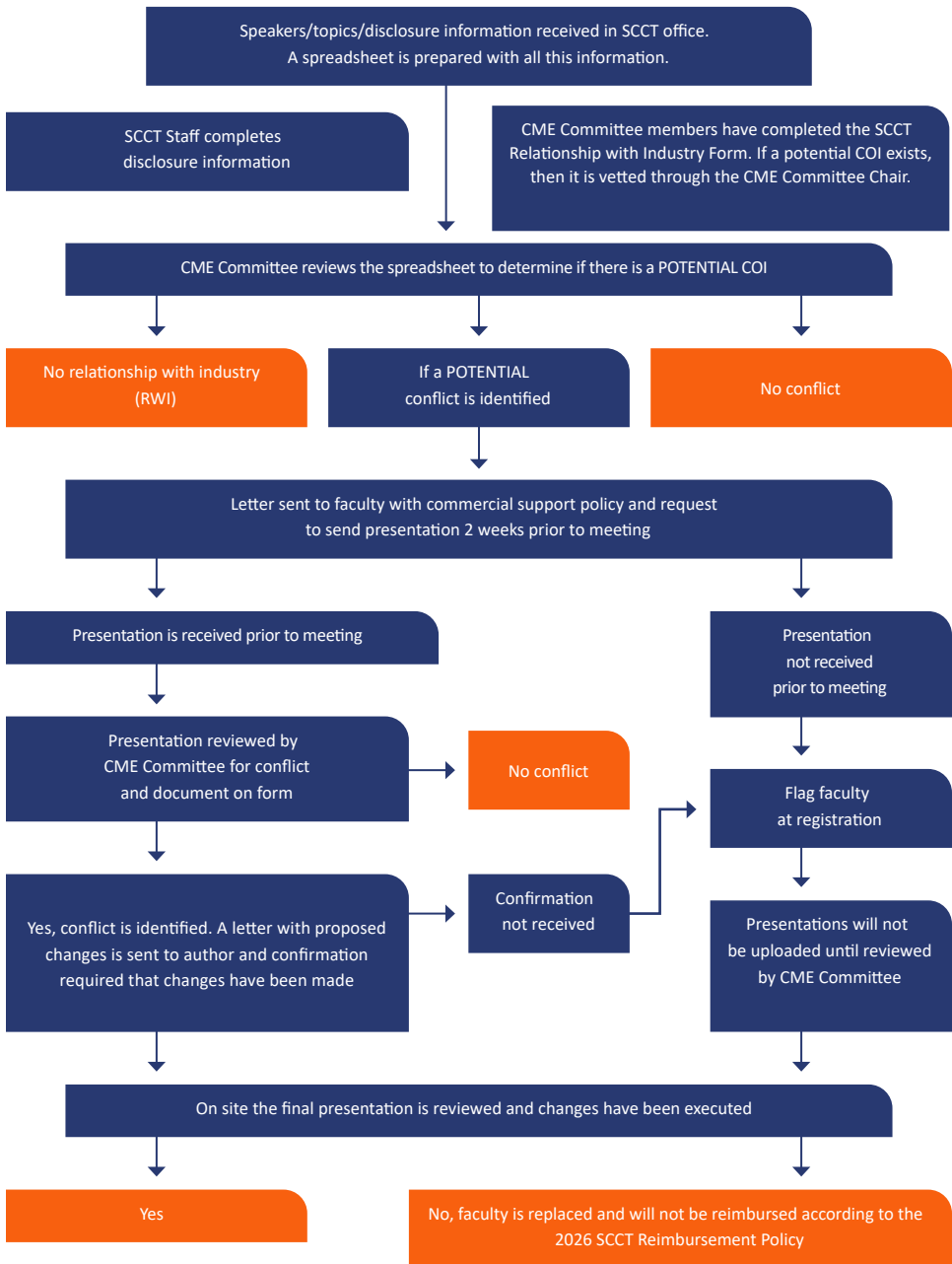
