The SDML Hall of Fame honors those elected and appointed officials and employees who have served municipalities in South Dakota for 20 or more years.



Mary Jo Nelson, Deadwood, 20 Years

Mary Jo started her employment in January 1998 as Finance Officer. She attended the University of South Dakota and Black Hills State University and graduated with an Accounting Degree, and obtained her M.B.A. from USD. She has served on the Deadwood Jam Board, Deadwood History Board, Deadwood Chamber of Commerce, and Deadwood-Lead Economic Development Board. Steve Hanson, Spearfish, 23 Years




