Cases of the Day Competition

Cases of the day constitute a variety of unknown interesting examinations of the gastrointestinal and genitourinary tract. Some of the cases are classic examples of a condition, others are more challenging – but all are diagnoses that can be made using the provided photographs. A variety of GI and GU organs and imaging modalities are explored.

The cases will be presented on four computers which will be located in the Grand Ballroom Pre-Assembly. Cases are also available via the online meeting syllabus. Each morning, from Monday through Wednesday, four new cases will be displayed; two cases will be geared toward GI radiology and the other two toward GU radiology. The cases have been contributed by representatives of the SAR. Radiologists should submit their best diagnosis along with two differentials daily by completing the appropriate online form. The correct answers will be displayed on a fifth computer on the following morning.

The winner and two runner-ups will be announced at the Awards Ceremony on Wednesday evening and on Friday morning at the beginning of the plenary session. They will also be posted on the message board in the registration area. Rewards can be claimed at the registration desk.

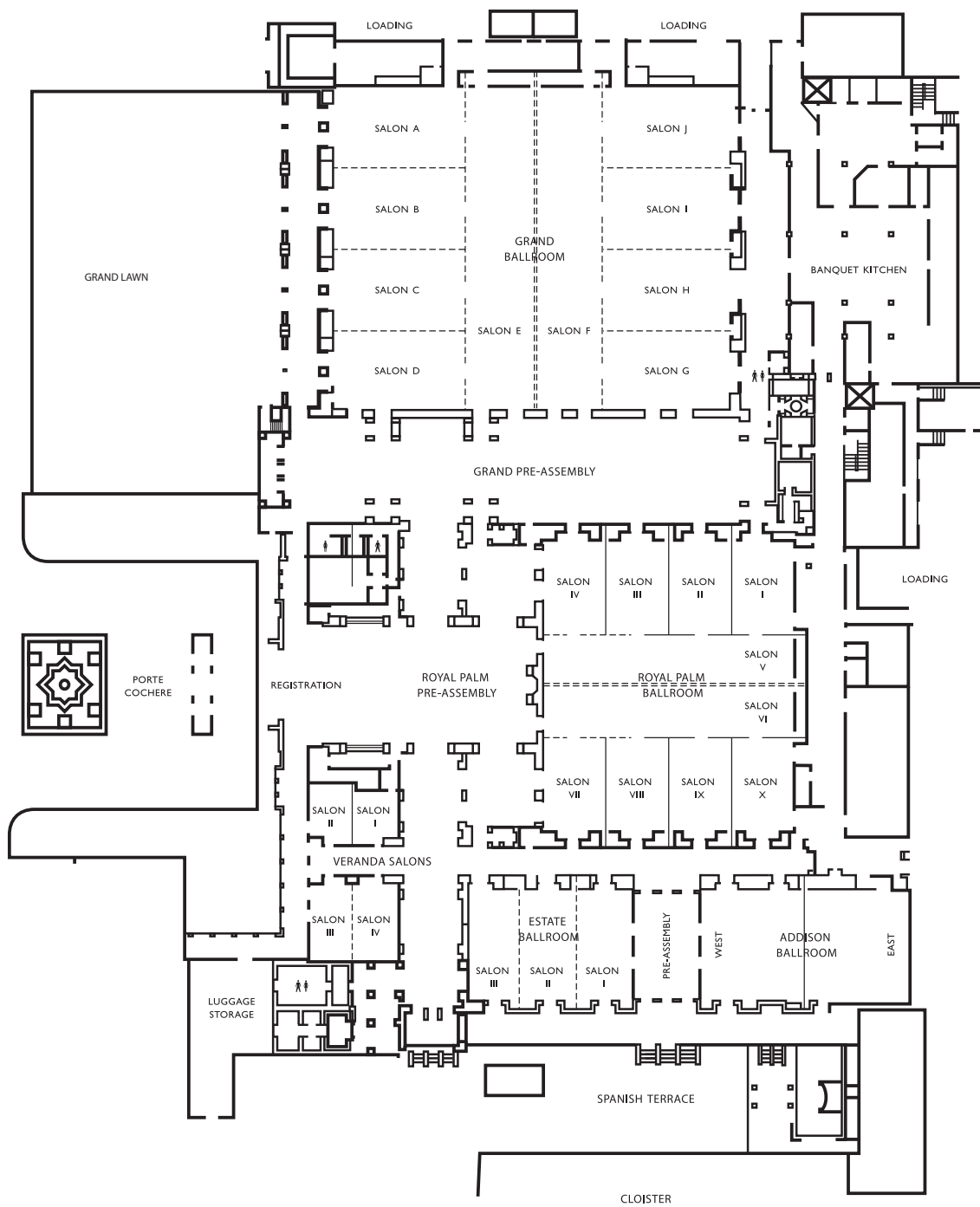
