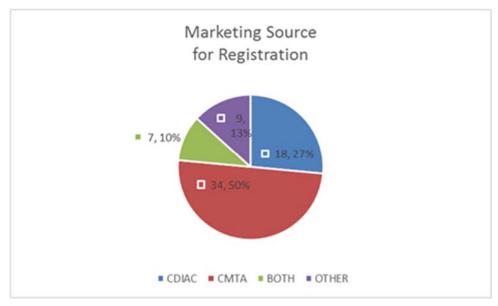

- 50% of the registrations are a result of CMTA marketing, while 27% came from CDIAC and 23% from other sources.
- Returned to CDIAC was a batch of 39 evaluations from the 53 attendees. Overall, the collaborative seminar was successful with an overall rating of 4.28/5.0 for its content. The facility rated overall at 4.1/5.0
- Participants found that a more advanced training program was timely and provided attendees with the important information to improve their knowledge, practice and skills in public investments. For the most part, attendees felt it was delivered at the advanced level, while 23% of the respondents felt it was at the intermediate level.
- This seminar was modified from prior offering in 2016 whereby less analysis was done of the
 permitted instruments. This might account for the 11 individuals who wanted more details
 on the analysis of the permitted instruments and why it was thought by some as an
 intermediate course. [Keep in mind that CDIAC provided precursory assignments with links to
 the educational webinars on Government Code and Permitted Instruments.

The speakers from day one did a fantastic job overall as witnessed by their overall grades.

- The session that may have lacked the most was session 2 on the advanced concepts. The key is not to have a Bloomberg representative teach that section as it was a lot of screenshots of Bloomberg surrounded by general discussion that was a little hard to follow. CDIAC provided Mr. Johnson with some feedback at the seminar to tailor the session with more basic illustrations of the advanced concepts.
- The last session was good but may have graded low because it was an end of day session.
 However, the speakers did a great job to keep it entertaining and unveiled a current topic of
 social investing. A few attendees pointed out that they liked the topic so it will be ripe for
 the CMTA general conference.

Day Two of the Workshop was well received with approximately 60% of the attendees returning for the case study.

- 18 evaluations were returned
- 15 attendees indicated that the Case Study session was most valuable part of Day Two, while two individual felt the introduction alone was the most valuable
- All respondents felt that the case study provided an applied approach to learning and also that the concepts discussed in Day One were reinforced in Day Two (Great)

Speakers for Day Two did a fantastic job and were graded excellent by most respondents.

Staff Recommendation:

Continue to use this agenda model for future public investment workshops. Incorporate a short session to refresh attendees of the permitted instruments or provide a handout as a take away and reference CDIAC's webinars on public investment fund management: Government Code and Permitted instruments. Rework the concepts session with an outline. Maybe refresh the credit analysis session slightly or place it earlier in the day.
