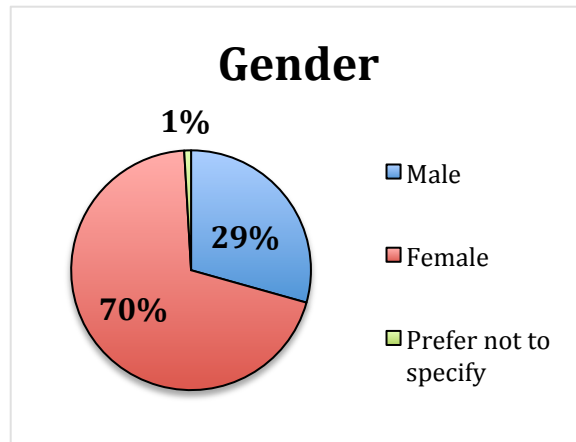
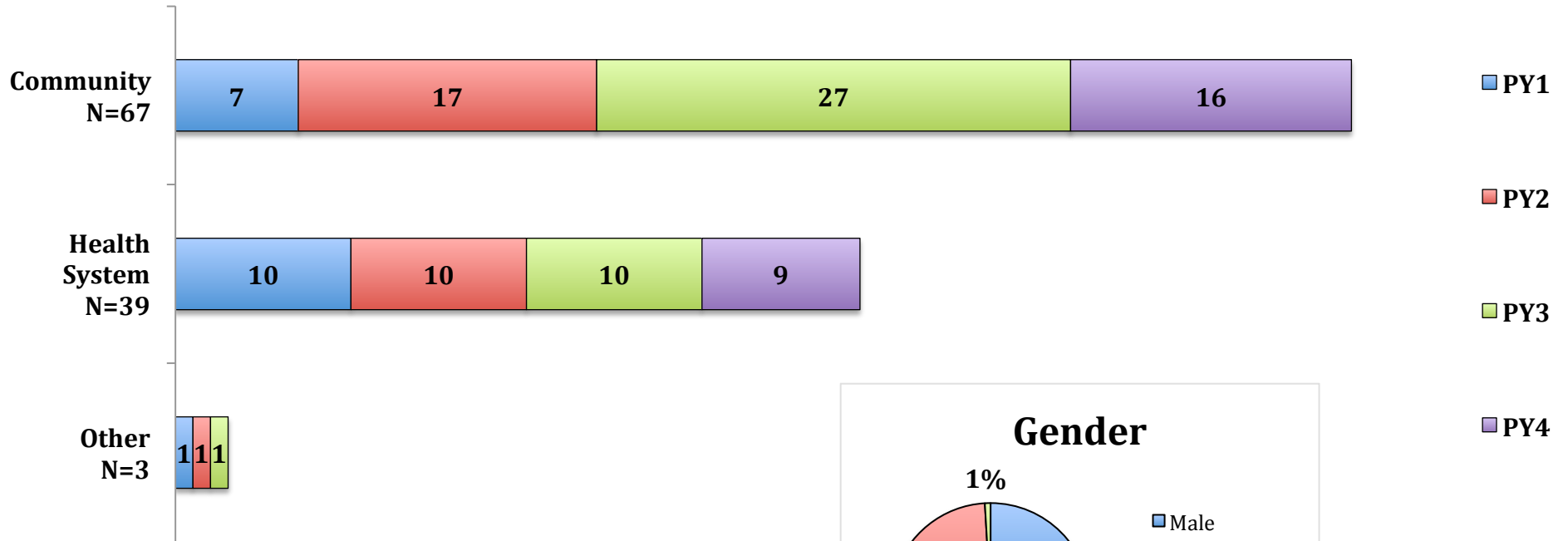


Salary and Benefits Survey for Pharmacist Interns 2014

The WSPA Salary Survey and Benefits Survey includes academic year, prevailing wages, and extent of employment for Interns in all Pharmacy settings in the State of Washington. The survey was conducted via an online survey tool, during Nov-Dec of 2014. Prevailing wages presented here are the median annual wages calculated from responses reported by Interns. There were 109 completed Pharmacist Intern surveys.

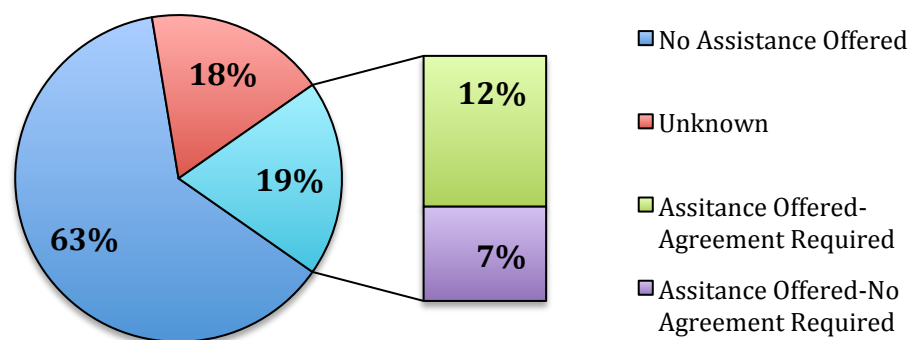


Q: What branch of pharmacy do you work in and what year of pharmacy school are you currently enrolled in?

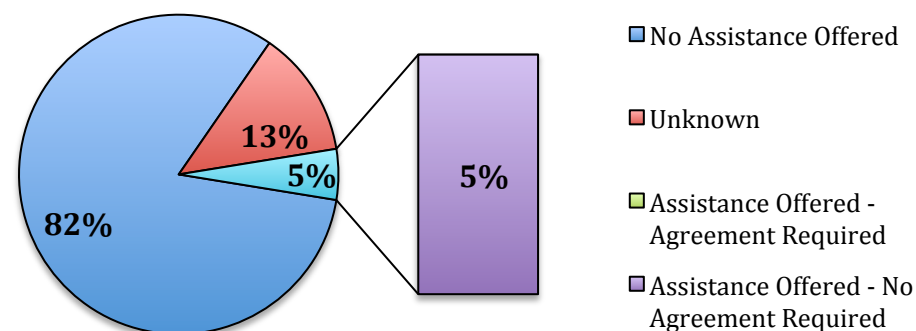


Tuition Assistance and Requirement of Employment Agreement after Graduation

Tuition Assistance - Community Setting

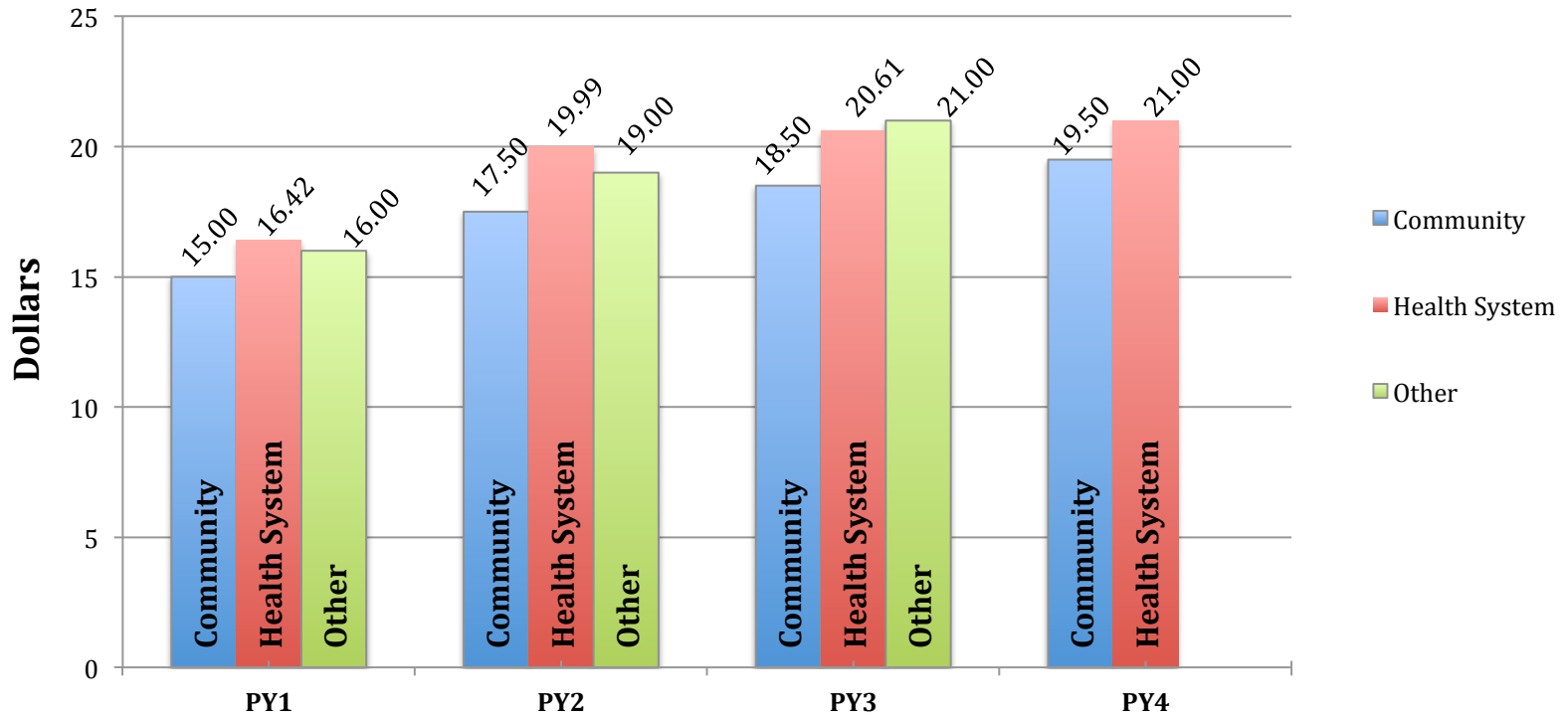


Tuition Assistance - Health Systems Setting

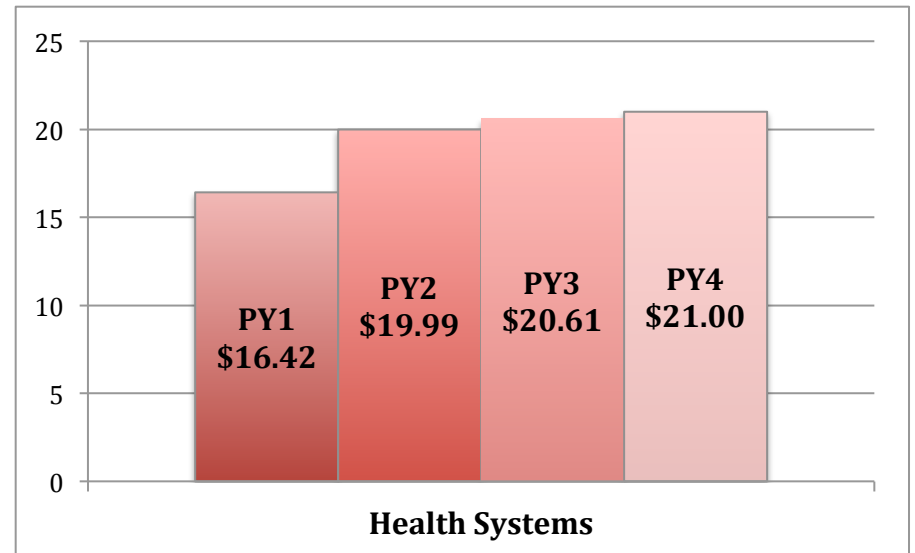
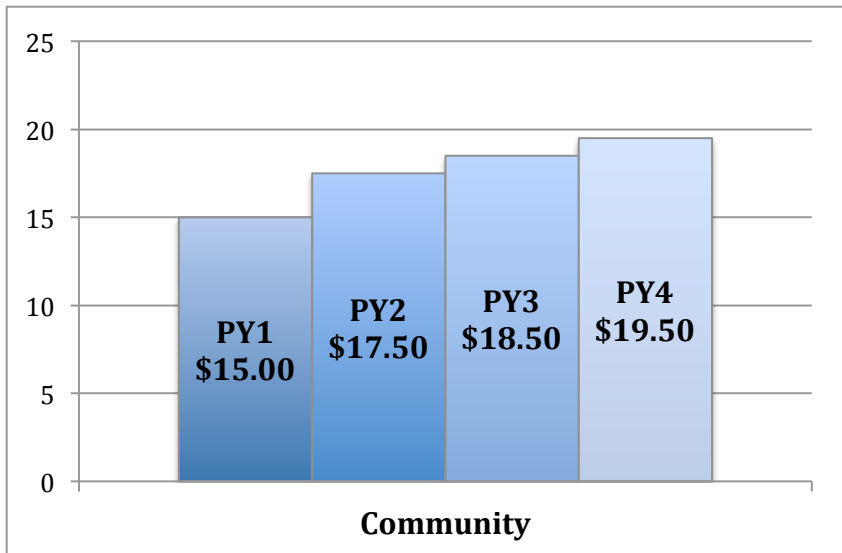


- Nearly 20% of Community Pharmacy Interns reported employers who offered tuition assistance, but a majority of those employers required an agreement after graduation in order to receive those benefits.
- Just 5% of Health system Interns reported employers who offered tuition assistance, but none of those employers required an agreement after graduation in order to receive those benefits.

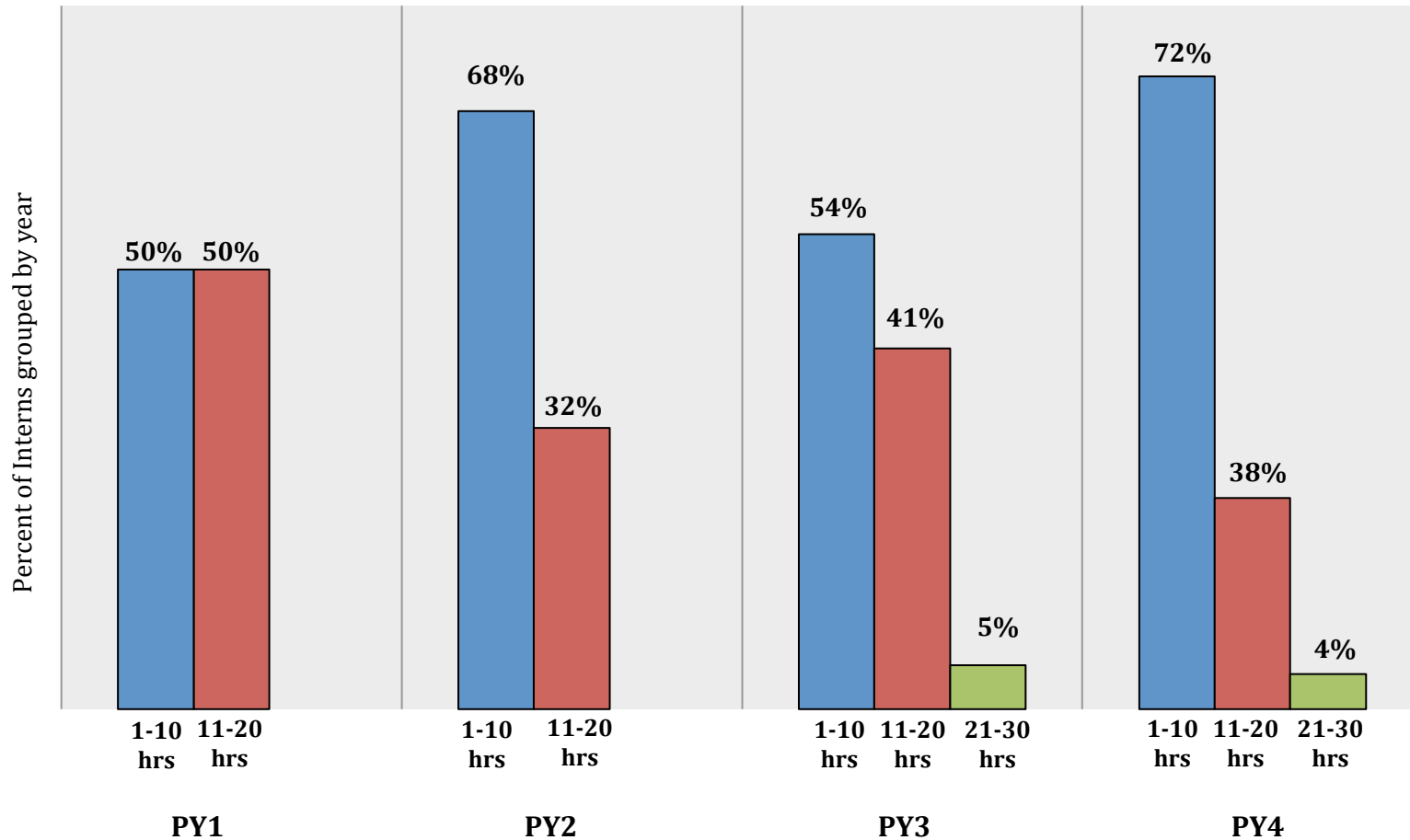
Median Reported Hourly Wages



Wage for each practice setting per academic year

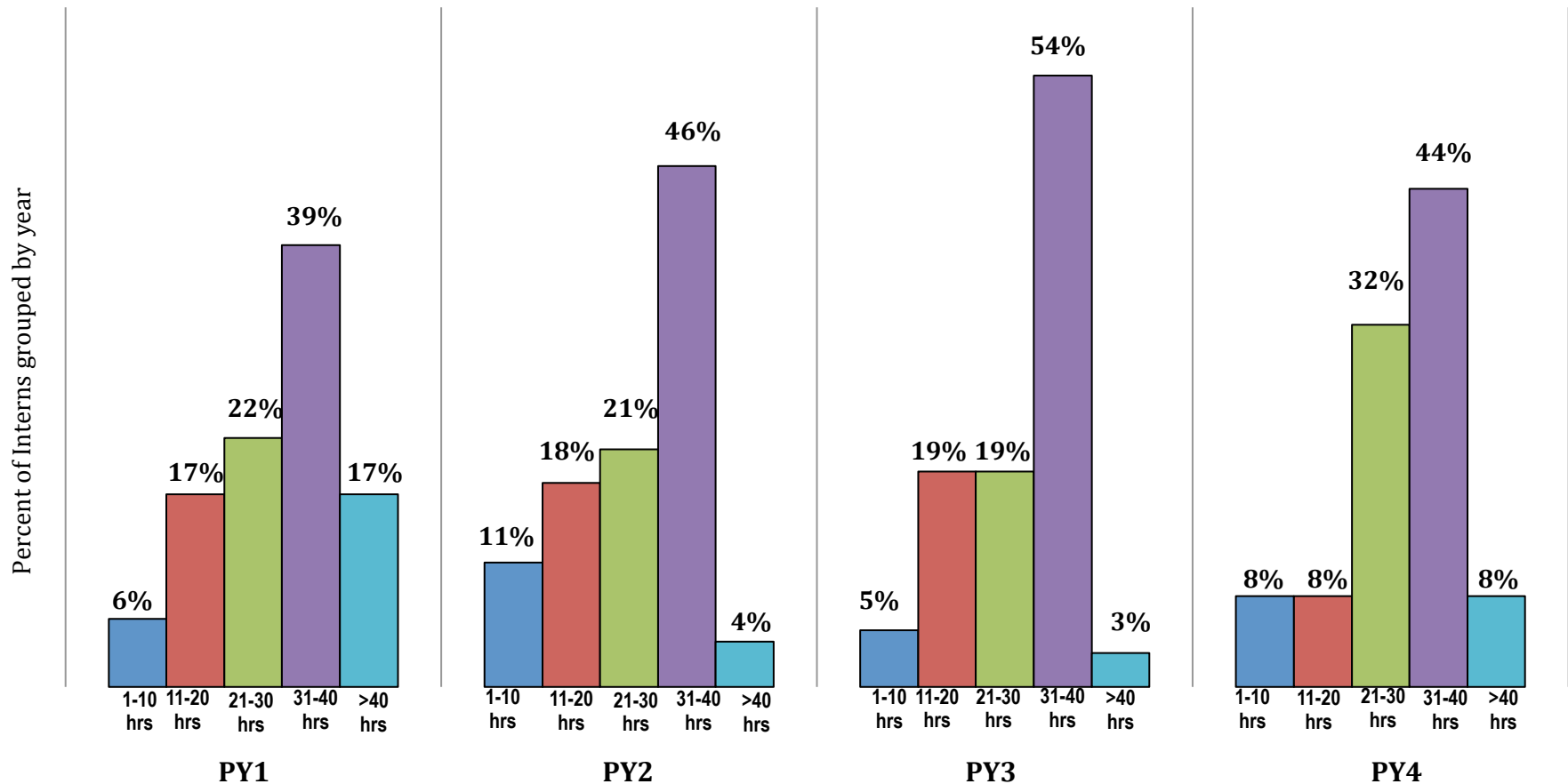


Hours Worked per Week During School



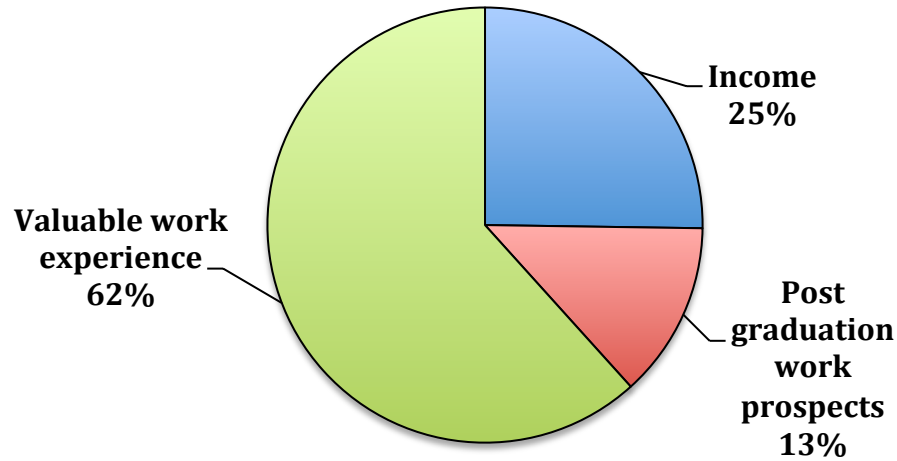
- The majority of interns of all academic years either worked 1-10 hours or 11-20 hours per week.
- At least half or more interns from each academic year worked 1-10 hours per week
- Only PY3's and PY4's had interns that worked 21-30 hours

Hours Worked per Week During School Breaks

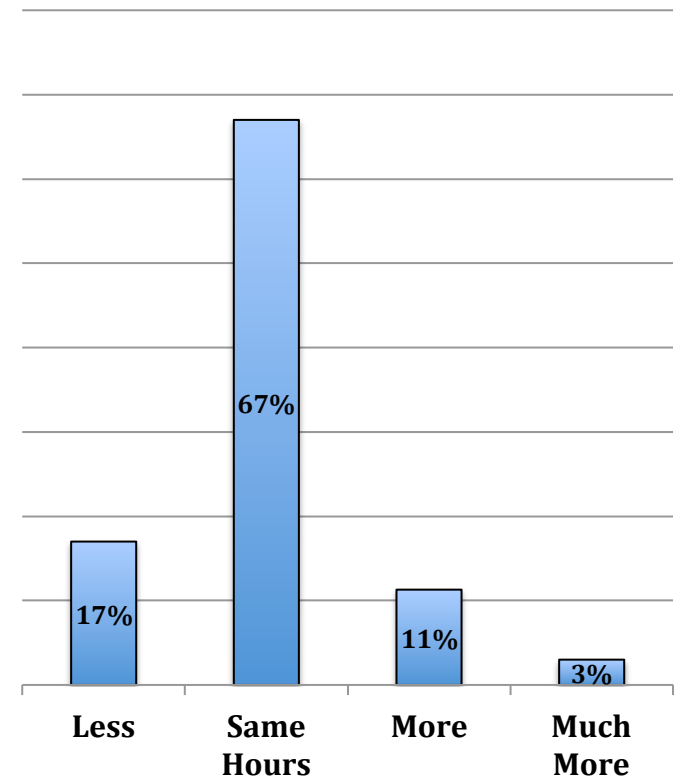


- Interns from all academic years worked significantly more during school breaks than during active school session
- The majority of interns from all academic years worked 31-40 hours per week during school breaks
