spotlight on: massachusetts educational theater guild

The Massachusetts Educational Theater Guild (METG) was founded in 1931 to promote and strengthen excellence, access, and education in the theatrical arts for middle and secondary school students and teachers. For over 80 years, METG has prospered and now boasts a full range of proven successful programs to its 160+ high school and middle school members, including: an urban outreach program to help launch and develop fledgling drama programs in underserved schools; certified professional development workshops for teachers; professional training workshops for students; technical assistance for schools to develop their performance spaces; and playwriting, video, and design contests for students.

Since its inception in 1983, the Sherwood Collins Playwriting Contest has generated more than 630 student-written plays, several of which have been published through partnerships with Baker's Plays and JAC Publishing. Since the establishment of acting and set design scholarship programs in 1992, the Guild has awarded more than \$70,000 to over 120 college-bound students. Last year saw the successful launch of the new MET Musical Theatre program in partnership with Broadway In Boston to reach those students and teachers who enjoy the experience of singing and dancing their way through a full scale musical theater production.



Every year, METG sponsors its largest annual event, now known as the Massachusetts High School Drama Festival, which has thrived to full capacity with over 3,000 students from 115 high schools performing, and more than 4,000 friends and family in attendance. In addition, the Guild runs a comparable Middle School Festival which has grown to 40 participating schools.

The Boston Theatre Celebration is a new METG program that will annually provide a one-day opportunity in June for Boston Public School students to share theatrical work, receive feedback, and forge connections with students in other schools.

Mission-based activities are planned and implemented by METG's Executive Councils, which are comprised of 40 theatre educators and theatre professionals. They provide the impetus for new initiatives and have deep understanding of the strengths and weaknesses of school drama programs. It is their vision that propels the growth potential of the organization.

spotlight on: wam theatre

Inspired by the book *Half the Sky: Turning Oppression into Opportunity for Women Worldwide* by Nicholas Kristof and Sheryl WuDunn, WAM Theatre (Women's Action Movement) was co-founded in 2010 by artistic director Kristen van Ginhoven. WAM Theatre has a unique double philanthropic mission: 1) producing theatrical events for everyone, with a focus on women theatre artists and/or stories of women and girls and 2) donating a portion of proceeds from those theatrical events to organizations that work to benefit the lives of women and girls in our communities and worldwide.

We've had many accomplishments since 2010 and our efforts proudly earned us a finalist place in the 'Creativity/Innovation' category of the 2013 Berkshire Trendsetter Awards.

Our accomplishments include: donating over \$10,500 to our six beneficiaries so far; providing work to over 75 theatre professionals, 75% of which are women; launching an education program that reached nearly 100 students; and, presenting many special events and main stage productions that explore issues relating to women and girls.

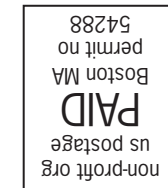
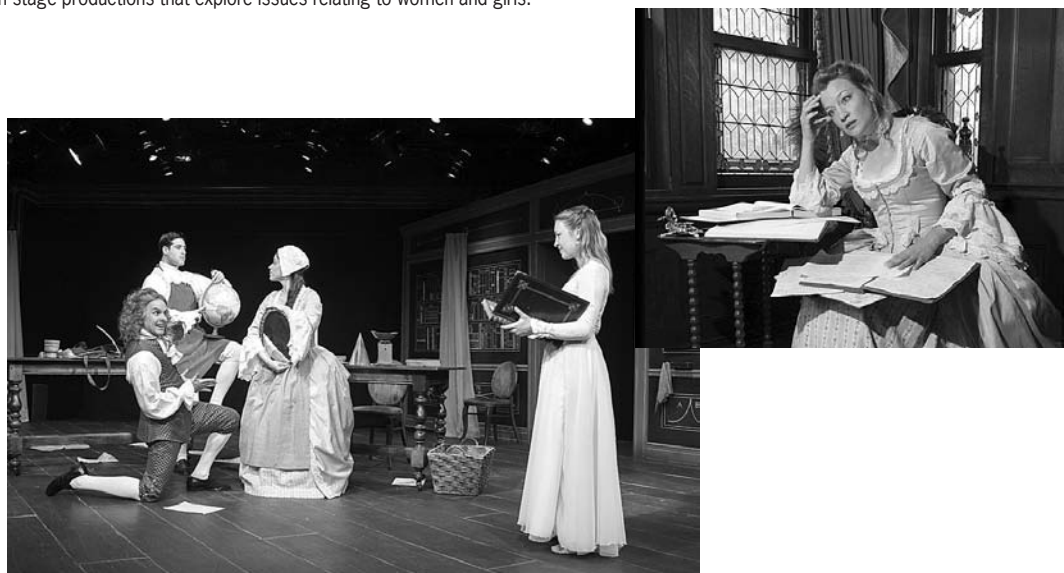

The funds we have donated to our beneficiaries are making a difference: the Women's Fund for Western Massachusetts used it towards their granting program, effectively making it triple philanthropy; the work of the Berkshire United Way's Teen Pregnancy Prevention Initiative is beginning to have an effect on the high rate of teen pregnancy in our area; and the Rite of Passage and Empowerment Program for Girls program will be able to send 12 young women on a college tour of the Northeast thanks to WAM's donation from our fall 2013 Northeast Regional Premiere of *Emilie: La Marquise Du Chatelet Defends Her Life* by Lauren Gunderson.

Our double philanthropic model is making an impact and it feels great!

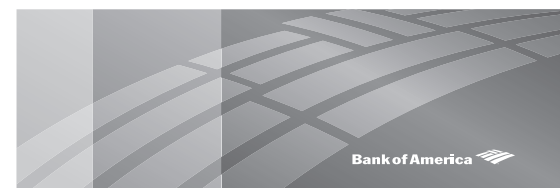
