## Dear Governor Parson:

I am writing to you on behalf of the St. Louis Area Business Health Coalition (BHC) and its members. Our network of 70 employers represent public and private-sector enterprises across a diverse range of industries, providing health benefits to over 500,000 lives in Missouri and many more across the nation. We implore you to continue to uphold the right of private businesses to implement and enforce COVID-19 vaccine policies for the health, safety, and economic well-being of their employees and customers.

Workforce safety and sustainability are top priorities of Missouri business leaders, and vaccine policies are critical to achieving both. Current case law supports an employer's ability to mandate vaccination and to require proof of vaccination for onsite interactions among employees, customers, and business partners. Any efforts to impede vaccine mandates among businesses is an intrusion on the rights of employers to provide for the health and safety of their workers and ensure operational and fiscal sustainability. We appreciate that you have not called a special session to consider legislation prohibiting COVID-19 vaccine mandates.

Some of the largest advancements in public health are due to the development of vaccines against serious infectious diseases, and COVID-19 is no different. While we also acknowledge the rights of individuals to choose not to be vaccinated, we cannot allow these decisions to threaten the health and economic security of others. Widespread vaccination is a critical step in helping our state recover from the pandemic and in preventing future threats.

Issues of public health and safety should not be politicized. The BHC and our employer members strongly urge that you and Missouri legislative leaders continue to uphold the right of individual businesses in encouraging immunization across our state.
