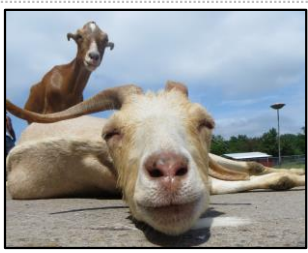

Livestock/Equine Placement Partner Memorandum of Agreement

Purpose

Lollypop Farm will transfer animals to certain animal welfare organizations, sanctuaries or private owners. Lollypop Farm recognizes the benefits associated with networking with other animal welfare agencies participating in re-homing of companion animals. Our goal is for Lollypop Farm and other animal welfare agencies to work collaboratively to re-home unwanted pets thereby reducing the numbers of animals euthanized annually in the Greater Rochester area. Ultimately we aim to increase the bond between pets and people by providing healthy, neutered/spayed pets to adopters.

Livestock/Equine Placement Partner Memorandum of Agreement

Roles and Responsibilities

Lollypop Farm and the placement partner will strive to best meet the needs of the animals by working together in an honest and collegial manner and agree to:

- Refrain from commenting or offering opinions on policies, procedures, or programs unless prior consent is obtained.
- Have a mutual understanding and respect for each other in spite of differing philosophies, focusing on the common ground among them.
- Refrain from sharing information in a public setting until the transfer is complete.

RESCUE REQUIREMENTS

- Full name, address, phone number for the group and for any group members who are authorized to contact us regarding animals and transfers.
- Copy of your 501(c)3 paperwork or other paperwork indicating non-profit status if applicable
- Your adoption application, policies and procedures, contract
- Foster home qualifications and follow up procedures
- A reference from a livestock or equine veterinarian who treats the rescue's animals
- A second community reference





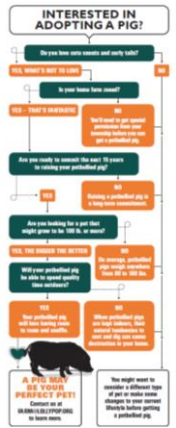
Pig Myth Epidemic and Education





- "Frisco" or "moo pigs" are really just baby potbellied pigs or meows. Sadly, some pig breeders share misinformation convincing owners to understand their pigs. While this helps the pigs, it leads to health issues that can be extremely harmful.
- Pigs require a large amount of space to roam, sniffle, dig, and root around. In fact, there are some of these fascinating pig activities! Pigs love using their snouts for rooting and foraging.
- Pig skin is very sensitive to the sun and they can get sunburn just like people. Since they can't sweat, pigs like to wallow in the mud to stay cool and protect their skin.
- A healthy potbellied pig can grow to weigh 80 - 100 lbs. Many pigs brought to Lollypop Farm are surrendered because they grew too big for the home they were living in.
- A healthy potbellied pig can live to be between 12 - 15 years old.
- Pigs are fast learners! They can also be good swimmers in shallow water.
- Pigs love being with other pigs. When they sleep, pigs like to cuddle close together to keep each other warm.
