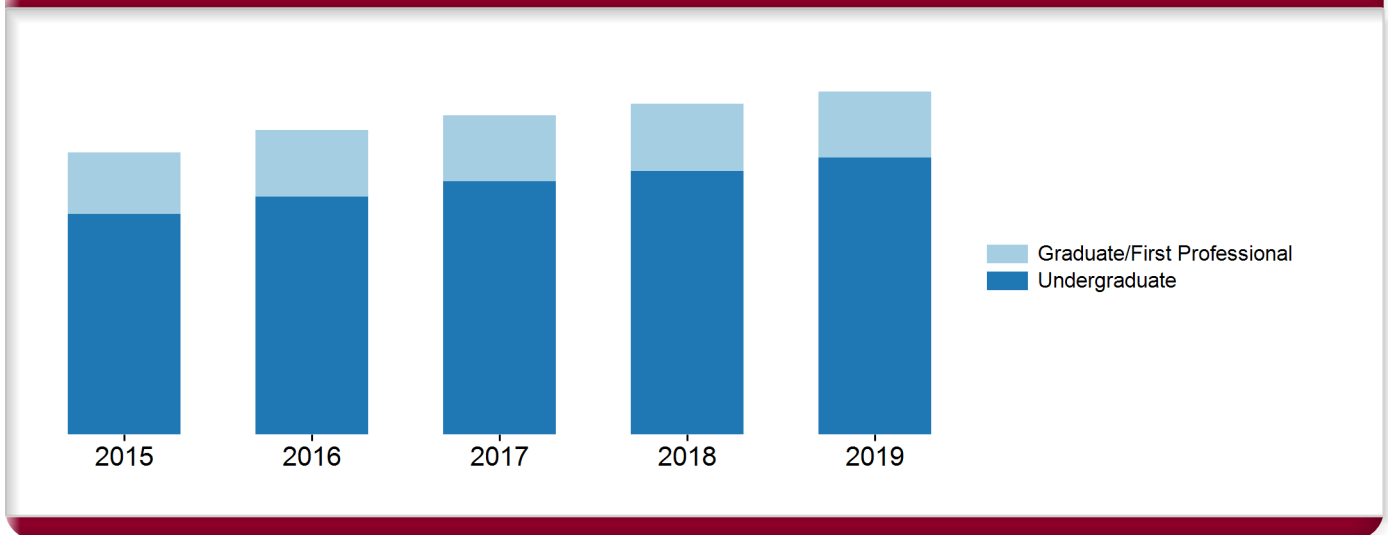

#### Fall Headcount Enrollment - Five-Year Trend



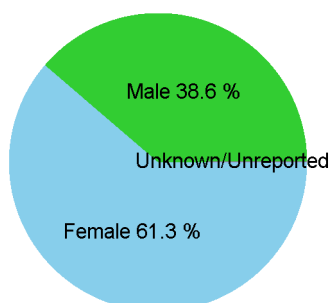

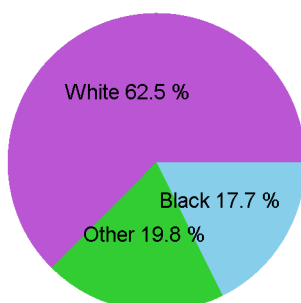

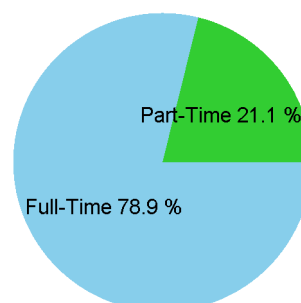
By Gender



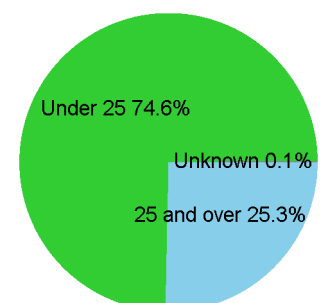
By Race

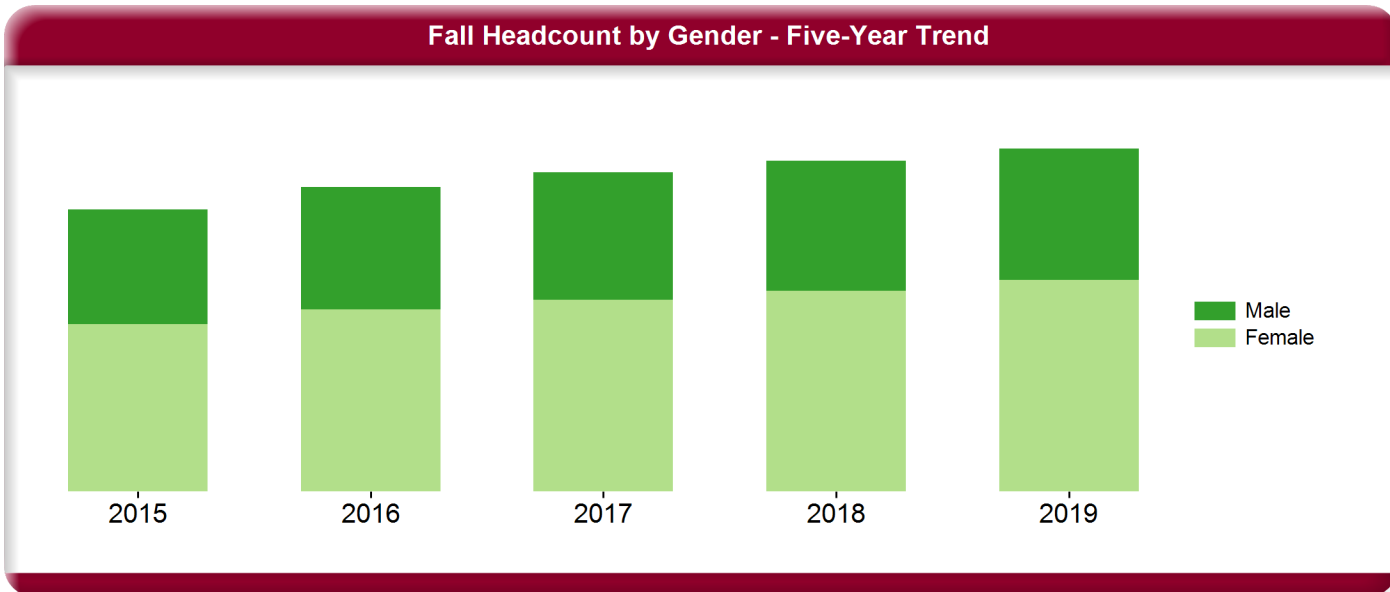

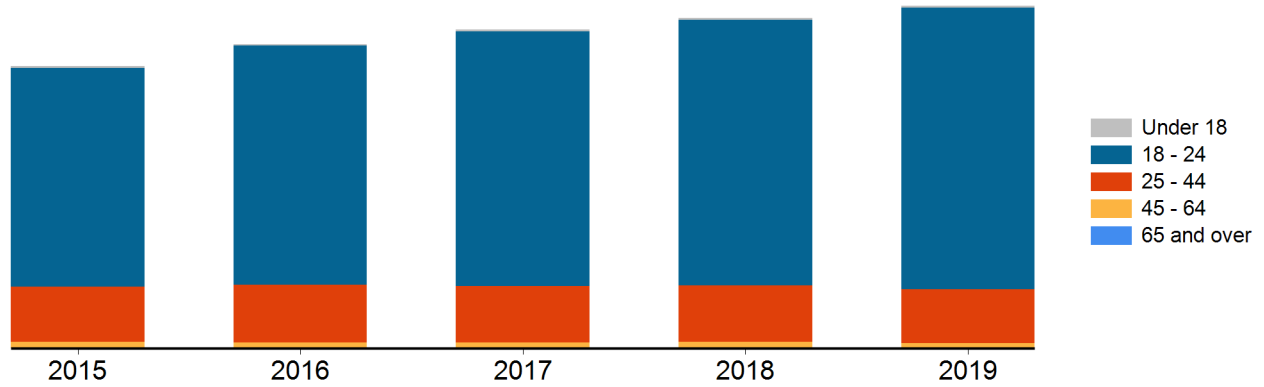
Fall Headcount by Gender - Five-Year Trend

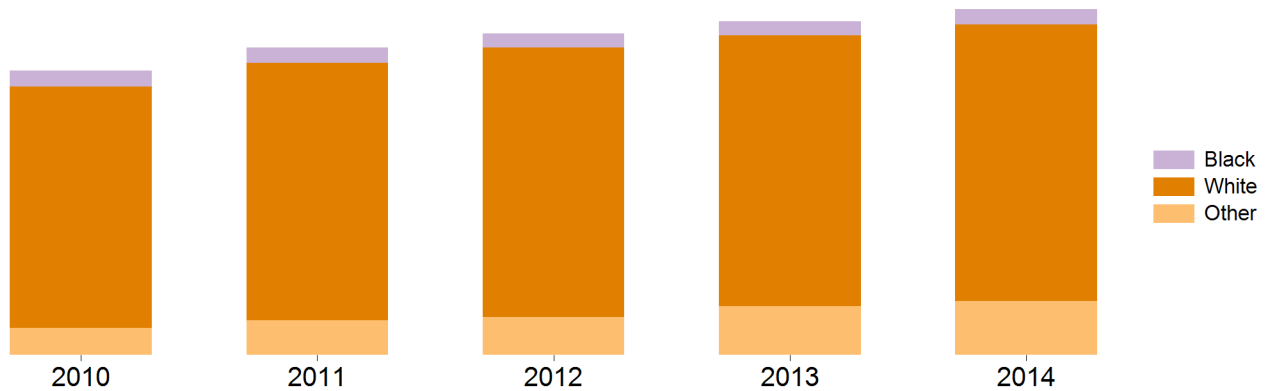

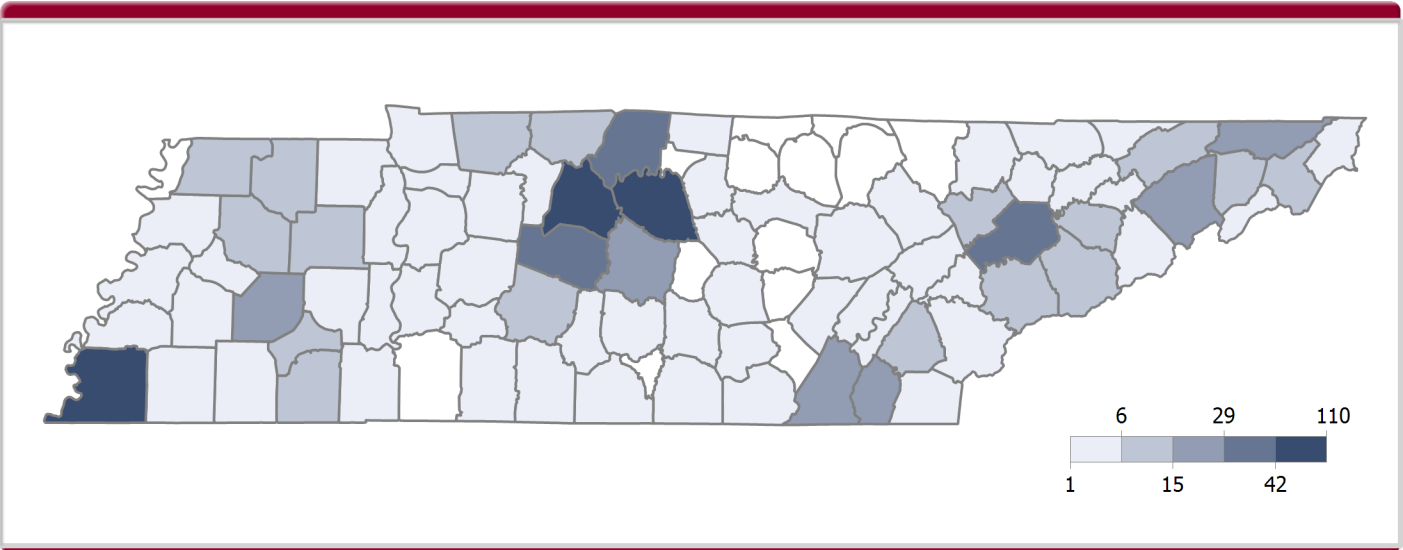

Fall Headcount by County Map



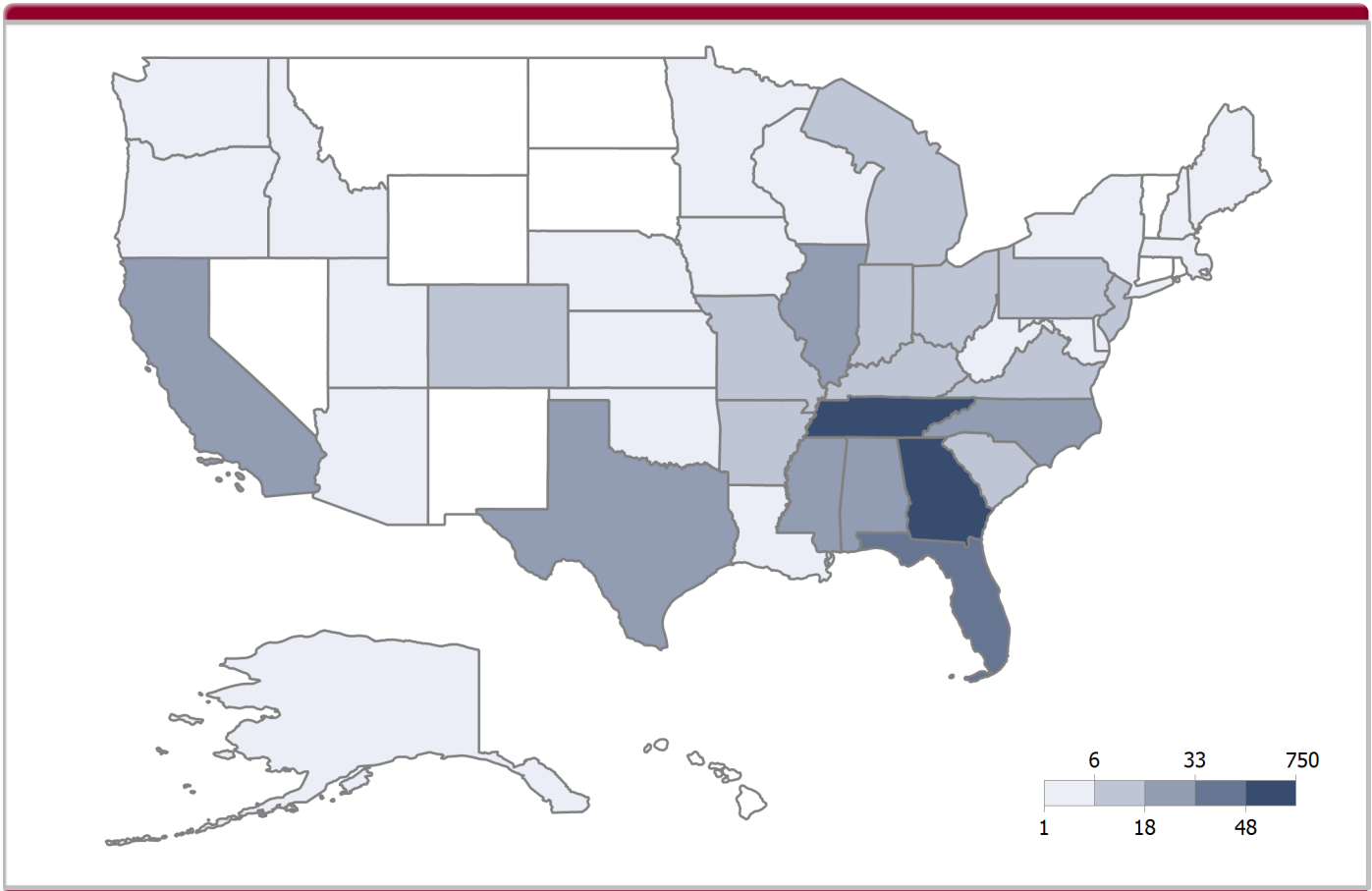
