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Letter from the Executive Director

As libraries continue to connect

in their communities, the work of The Library Network (TLN) is to connect our member libraries. This year the cooperative accomplished many things to help libraries provide greater access to shared resources. The Library Network is Libraries Working Together.

Our core activities directly impact service to the public. The shared library catalog offers 4 million items for request and checkout. Coupled with our delivery services, those items are often available overnight, to the millions of residents in our service region. This year we were excited to begin a multi-year project to move libraries and TLN to RFID technology, which will lay a stronger foundation for these services in the future. TLN believes that together, libraries can accomplish more.

Our direct-to-patron services also saw growth this year. The Michigan Activity Pass (MAP) saw exponentially increased use. Our Download Destination collections for the first time ever collectively saw over two million checkouts for electronic resources. The cooperative this year made new financial investments in these services.

The Library Network continues to engage library workers to build our collective communities. Members participated in committee work, helped to craft new policies, and worked to support access and inclusion for all. Our work will continue to support library workers as well as the public that we all serve together.

I welcome you to take a look through the annual report to see more highlights from our year in review.



The Michigan Activity Pass continues to wow as we celebrate a year from the new website launch. Here are some statistics on how the program was used this year.






TLN has negotiated discounted prices for Encompass EAP through AllOne Health, which provides mental health counseling, work/life resources, legal/financial resources, and more.

TLN's RFID Project



The mission of The Library Network is to help libraries partner together to maximize access to library materials. Our core services include our shared library catalog (SAS) and our delivery system, which together help libraries to share 1.5 million items a year. As sharing continues to grow TLN is looking to the future, and planning to assist libraries in adopting RFID technology, which will increase our ability to share resources.


Library cooperatives such as TLN were created to provide member libraries with shared services. This often means cooperatives offer services that individual libraries may find difficult or financially impossible to offer on their own. Adoption of RFID is one such service that TLN is now planning to take on as a cooperative group.

TLN began this project by advancing discussion with the SAS membership. Along with assisting libraries to move to RFID technology the first phases of the project will also establish a framework for the TLN Delivery and Sorting Team to use an Automated Materials Handling (AMH) system in-house for more efficient and sustainable work in the future. Potentially all members of TLN can benefit from the project with reduced costs for RFID materials and supplies, even for libraries using their own systems.

Through the TLN Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion Committee, a new EDI Statement highlighting TLN's framework around the work to uplift underrepresented communities was completed this year.

The document includes initial definitions for Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion along with related ideas, definitions for what underrepresented means, what we are defining as underrepresented communities, and the actions being taken to help.

The document is living, given that new definitions and concepts may need to be added in the future.

Fine Free Statement



TLN's Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion Committee has worked to complete a Fine Free Statement, meant to help educate boards and other decision makers as to the impact of removing overdue fines at their library. Libraries in and out of TLN have been considering making this choice for themselves and may need additional tools to help start the discussion. Some of the advantages highlighted include:



library access is maximized for all



improved staff morale through reduction in negative patron interactions



increased circulation of library materials



costs are reduced for tracking and processing fines



long overdue, lost, and missing materials are returned, reducing material and financial loss



burden of enforcement and confrontation removed from staff



stigma and shame for tardiness is removed



the library is viewed as being true to core values and supportive of the community

Workplace Perceptions Survey

After feedback from our Community Groups, the TLN Board issued the request to do a Workplace Perceptions Survey across libraries in the TLN cooperative. Library staff and TLN employees were asked a series of questions relating to their perceptions of the climate and culture of their employer, giving space for staff to talk about harassment or discrimination they have received.

With 868 library employees completing the survey, iLabs from U of M Dearborn's School of Business was able to provide a snapshot of how library staff feel at their libraries currently. The results will continue to guide the cooperative in the years to come.



Communities

TLN proudly hosts affinity groups called Communities that allow for networking and comradery amongst members of groups of underrepresented library staff. These groups host at minimum a virtual talk each month for people to come in and talk with members of their community.



Vibrant Voices

Hosting space for members of the BIPOC (Black, Indigenous, and People of Color) communities, Vibrant Voices is home to library staff that identify with an underrepresented racial or ethnic identity.



Rainbow Connection

Hosting space for members of the LGBTQIA+ (Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Queer/Questioning, Intersex, and Asexual) communities, Rainbow Connection is hosts library staff that identify with an underrepresented sexual orientation or gender identity.

As we continue to provide space for affinity groups, a new one is being formed for those in the Disability community. Join our group and help us give it a name!

Up from last year, 32 library employees descended on Detroit to walk with The Library Network in Motor City Pride. Our representation in the parade reminds the LGBT+ community and their allies that libraries are for everyone and celebrate their identities.





Crisis Management



TLN Staff handled 2 crisis events in 2024. During each, our response team addressed issues that arose at libraries and at the TLN Office to resolve maters swiftly.

Crowdstrike Outage

The Crowdstike outage of 2024 will be remembered as a global event that took down computers in every industry. TLN Staff worked to address the issue with a work-around, creating a video tutorial for library staff to watch on how to address the issue. Phone calls and visits were also used to further assist those who needed help.




