1 Proficiency System

1.1 Dance groups and levels

- The class level is objective measurement of the athlete's progress in DanceSport ability
- The class level is independent of the age categories.
- The following notations for dances are used:

1.1.1 N-class

- N-class level includes 2 required dances in Standard (W, Q), Latin (S, C), Smooth (AW, AF) and Rhythm (AC, AR).
- Points can be earned only in Invigilated Syllabus events.

1.1.2 E-class

- E-class level includes 3 required dances in Standard (W, V, Q), Latin (S, C, J) and Rhythm (AC, AR, SW) and 2 required dances in Smooth (AW, AF). Other dances from each style (T, F), (R, P), (AT, AV), (M, B) also can be counted toward the proficiency points, but they are not required to be eligible to level up to D-class.
- Points can be earned only in Invigilated Syllabus events.

1.1.3 D-class

- D-class level includes 4 required dances in Standard (W, T, V, Q), Latin (S, C, R, J) and Rhythm (AC, AR, SW, M) and 3 required dances in Smooth (AW, AT, AF). Other dances from each style (F), (P), (AV), (B) also can be counted toward the proficiency points, but they are not required to be eligible to level up to C-class.
- Points can be earned only in Silver or Gold Invigilated Syllabus events.

1.1.4 C-class

- C-class level includes all dances in each style as required dances.
- Points can be earned in Gold Invigilated Syllabus or Open events.

1.1.5 B-class, A-class and S-class

- B-Class, A-Class and S-Class have all dances in each style as the required dances.
- Points can be earned only in Open (non-syllabus) events for these classes.

NOTE: The level of a couple (1.3.6) is determined as of the beginning of the competition.

1.1.6 Level of the event and Syllabus invigilation

- The class level of the event is defined by the organizer. All couples entered must be the class level of the event or lower.
- The organizer can define the minimum class level. In this case, all couples entered must be not lower than this class level.
- Invigilation level of the event is defined by the organizer as Invigilated or Open. The invigilation will be done according to the announced Syllabus level.

1.2 Events with different proficiency levels of the couples - Mixed Class Event

1.2.1 Judging and awarding in the mixed class events

- All couples will dance together and the judges will mark them as one group.
- After the Final, the results can be announced separately for each Proficiency level, if the competition software has the required capability. See 1.3.2.
- The proficiency points will be calculated after the competition.

1.2.2 Participation in the mixed class events and higher class events

- A couple's eligibility to participate in the event will be defined based on the section 1.3.6 and the associated notes in section 1.1.
- Any proficiency points earned in the higher level events will be awarded to the couple's currently assigned proficiency level.

1.3 Proficiency points and moving from level to level

1.3.1 The concept

- A couple earns points, but each dancer collects points independently from a partner.
- A couple (dancer in case of Solo proficiency event) earns points by outplacing couples (dancers) of the same or a higher level. A couple (dancer) does not earn points by outplacing couples (dancers) of a lower level.
- A dancer starts to collect points from zero in each class level.
- If a couple participates in the event but is not registered in USA Dance, this couple will be treated as a couple with the highest class level of the participating registered couples. This will be done only for the purpose of calculation of points for the registered couples.
The dancers who are not registered will not be awarded any points and they will not be registered with a permanent class level.

1.3.2 How to earn points

There are 4 types of points earned:

- A couple earns one point for each round in which it dances.
- A couple earns one point if it places first in its class (provided the event is contested).
- A couple earns points based on its placement.
- A couple earns extra points for each outplaced couple of a higher level.

1.3.2.1 Terminology:

- **Couple's Place** [PL]
 - *Single Class Event* – placement of the couple in the event.
 - *Mixed Class Event* – placement of the couple is based on the number of couples of the same or lower class that outplaced this couple. *See example 1*

- **Placement Point Eligible couple** – a couple who places not lower than 11th place in its class.
Note the difference between Single Class and Mixed Class events.
- **Number of Couples (in class)** [NC] – the sum of **Couple's Place** [PL] and the number of all couples of the same level and higher outplaced by this couple.
Note: NC does not represent the number of couples of a class entered in an event. It is a calculated number which can be different for each couple and depends on the number of couples of lower class who outplaced this couple and the number of couples of a higher class who were outplaced by this couple.
- **Placement Points** [PLP] - points calculated by the formula:
If NC is equal to or more than 12: **PLP = 12 - PL.**
If NC is less than 12: **PLP = NC - PL.**
- **Champion Point** [CP] – the point awarded for winning the class.
- **Progressive Points** [PRP] – the points awarded for each round. One point is awarded per round for a One Style event and two points per round for a Two Style event.
- **Superior Points** [SP] – the points awarded for each outplaced couple of a higher level. One point is awarded for each couple whose class is one level higher and two points are awarded for each couple whose class is two levels higher.

- 1.3.2.2 Each couple gets **Progressive Points** for each round in which it dances regardless of whether it becomes **Placement Point Eligible**.
- 1.3.2.3 The first place couple (PL) is awarded an additional **Champion Point**. In the Mixed Class events, the first place couple in each class is awarded a Champion Point.
- 1.3.2.4 **Superior Points** are awarded for all outplaced couples of higher levels regardless of that couple's placement.
- 1.3.2.5 The score earned in the multi-dance events is multiplied by the number of dances in the event.

See the appendix for the sample chart of the awarded points for one dance depending on the number of participating couples and the place taken by the couple.

Examples (one dance event)

1. **Couple's Place calculation in Mixed Class event.**
There are 12 couples in the event: 7 couples of D-class level and 5 couples of E-class level. The highest E-class couple became 5th overall. This means it is actually 1st among E-class couples. The next E-class couple became 8th overall, but it is 2nd in E-class.
2. **Proficiency Points calculation in Single Class event.**
There are 9 couples in the event. All couples have the same level. The event starts with the semi-final. Couples from 1st to 6th places will each be awarded 2 progressive points for dancing two rounds; couples from 7th to 9th places will each be awarded 1 progressive point for dancing in one round. Also, places from 1st to 8th will be awarded based on the particular place: 1st – $8_{(PLP)} + 2_{(PRP)} + 1_{(CP)} = 11$ points, 2nd – $7_{(PLP)} + 2_{(PRP)} = 9$, 3rd – $6_{(PLP)} + 2_{(PRP)} = 8$, 4th – $5_{(PLP)} + 2_{(PRP)} = 7$, 5th – $4_{(PLP)} + 2_{(PRP)} = 6$, 6th – $3_{(PLP)} + 2_{(PRP)} = 5$, 7th – $2_{(PLP)} + 1_{(PRP)} = 3$, 8th – $1_{(PLP)} + 1_{(PRP)} = 2$, 9th – $0_{(PLP)} + 1_{(PRP)} = 1$
3. **Proficiency Points calculation in Mixed Class event – case 1**
There are 5 couples in the event: one couple of C-class level and 4 couples of D-class level. The C-class couple got first overall place and it will be awarded 1_(PRP) point. D-class couples PLs will have 1st to 4th places in class accordingly. They will be awarded: 2nd overall place (1st in D) – $3_{(PLP)} + 1_{(CP)} + 1_{(PRP)} = 5$ points, 3rd overall (2nd

in D) – $2_{(PLP)} + 1_{(LPP)} = 3$ points, 4th overall (3rd in D) – $1_{(PLP)} + 1_{(LPP)} = 2$ points, 5th overall (4th in D) – $0_{(PLP)} + 1_{(LPP)} = 1$ point.

4. Proficiency Points calculation in Mixed Class event – case 2

The same 5 couples are in the event but the C-class couple got 2nd overall place and one of the D-class couples got 1st overall place. The C-class couple will be awarded $1_{(LPP)}$ point. The first overall couple will be awarded as for a 5-couples event, but other D couples will be awarded as for 4-couples event. 1st overall place – $4_{(PLP)} + 1_{(CP)} + 1_{(SP)} + 1_{(LPP)} = 7$ points, 3rd place (2nd out of 4) – $2_{(PLP)} + 1_{(LPP)} = 3$, 4th place (3rd out of 4) – $1_{(PLP)} + 1_{(LPP)} = 2$, 5th place (4th out of 4) – $0_{(PLP)} + 1_{(LPP)} = 1$.

1.3.3 Minimum Number of points required to move to the next proficiency level (*)

1.3.3.1 Points are collected separately in each style. If the dancer has collected the required Minimum Number of points only in one style, he/she can advance only in this style. Smooth style has only 4 dances and different numbers of the required dances in E and D classes, so its associated numbers are listed separately.

- To move from N to E - 24 points
- To move from E to D - 108 points / Smooth – 72 points
- To move from D to C - 192 points / Smooth – 144 points
- To move from C to B - 300 points / Smooth – 240 points
- To move from B to A - 360 points / Smooth – 288 points
- To move from A to S - 420 points / Smooth – 336 points

(*) This is based on the assumption that the system uses 12 Placement Point Eligible Places.

The proposed Minimum Number of points required for a dancer to level up is based on the premise that: If the dancer places first in 1 event (2 required dances) in N-class, 3 events (3 required dances / 2 for Smooth) in E-class, 4(4/3) in D-class, 5(5/4) in C-class, 6(5/4) in B class and 7(5/4) in A-class, it will be sufficient to acquire the skills and competition experience necessary to move to the next level.

1.3.4 Minimum Number of Points in Each Dance (**)

1.3.4.1 A dancer may have a different number of points in each dance, but he/she must collect, as a minimum, the following number of points in each dance. This is applicable to all styles.

- N-class – 6 in each required dance
- E-class – 18 in each required dance
- D-class – 24 in each required dance
- C-class – 30 in each dance
- B-class – 36 in each dance
- A-class – 42 in each dance

Examples:

1. To advance from E to D only in Latin the couple may have 18 points in Cha-cha, 38 points in Samba and 52 points in Jive
2. To advance from C to B only in Standard the couple may have 54 points in Waltz, Tango, Foxtrot, Quickstep (each) and 84 points in Viennese Waltz.

(**) The Minimum Number of Points in Each Dance is 50% of the Minimum Number of points required for a dancer to level up divided by number of the dances in the level. For example, in E-class: $108/2=54/3=18$

1.3.5 Maximum Number of points when the couple must move to the next proficiency level (***)

- Must move from N to E - 48 points
- Must move from E to D - 144 points / Smooth – 96 points
- Must move from D to C - 240 points / Smooth – 180 points
- Must move from C to B - 360 points / Smooth – 336 points
- Must move from B to A - 420 points / Smooth – 384 points
- Must move from A to S - 480 points / Smooth – 432 points

(***)This is based on the assumption that the system uses 12 Placement Point Eligible places.

The proposed maximum number of points, when a dancer has to level up, is based on the premise that: if the dancer participates in one event with 10-12 couples and places first after earning the required minimum to level up, the dancer must move to the next higher class.

- 1.3.5.1 When one of the partners collects the Maximum Number of points for the current class the couple can dance at that proficiency level until the other partner has the Minimum Number of Points in Each Dance (1.3.4). The partner with the Maximum Number of points will not collect any points.

1.3.6 The proficiency level of a partnership

The proficiency level of a partnership (couple) is determined as:

- 1.3.6.1 If both partners have the same proficiency level, the couple is assigned that proficiency level.
- 1.3.6.2 If the partner P1 has a higher class than the partner P2 and P1 has already collected the Minimum Number of Points in Each Dance toward the next level (1.3.4), this partnership will have the level of the partner A with the higher class.

Example: one partner has C-class and has collected 40 points in each dance toward B-class. This couple will be treated as C-class couple and may not enter D-class level events.

- 1.3.6.3 If the partner P1 has a higher class than the partner P2 but P1 hasn't collected the Minimum Number of Points in Each Dance toward the next level (1.3.4) and the partner P2 (who has one level lower class) has earned the Minimum Number of Points for Each Dance toward the next level, this new partnership will have the level of the partner with the higher class.

Example:

If the partner P1 has C-class and has less than 30 points in each dance toward B-class level and the partner P2 has D-class level and has 24 points in each dance, this couple will be treated as a C-class couple and may not enter D-class level events.

- 1.3.6.4 If the partner P1 has one level higher class than the other partner P2 but P1 hasn't collected the Minimum Number of Points in Each Dance toward the next level (1.3.4) and the partner P2 (who has one level lower class) also hasn't earned the Minimum Number of Points for Each Dance toward the next level, this new partnership will have the level of the partner with the lower class. The couple can participate in the events with the level of the partner with the lower class. The partner with the higher class will not earn points.

Example:

If the partner P1 has C-class and has less than 30 points in each dance toward B-class level and the partner P2 has D-class level and doesn't have 24 points in each dance, this couple will be treated as a D-class couple and may enter D-class level events.

- 1.3.6.5 If a couple enters a multi-style event and the couple's class levels are different for the styles offered in the event, the highest class level will be used as the couple's class level in this event. The points will be calculated accordingly, but they will be added toward the current class level of each partner in each style.

Example:

A couple enters a 10-dance event. Based on rules 1.3.6.1-4, the couple has C-class in Latin and D-class in Standard. This couple will be treated as C-class in all calculations. The couple will not get Superior Points for defeating C-class couples in Latin.

1.3.7 The proficiency level of a single dancer without a partner

- 1.3.7.1 A single dancer with no permanent partner can collect proficiency points at any event where only one partner is judged.
- 1.3.7.2 A single dancer can collect proficiency points at Solo Proficiency. The number of earned proficiency points will be calculated the same way as for couples.
- 1.3.7.3 Proficiency points can be earned by an amateur student in Mixed Proficiency, Teacher/Student or Pro/Am events. The number of proficiency points will be divided by two.
- 1.3.7.4 All the proficiency rules are applicable in this case.

1.3.8 Class reduction option

- 1.3.8.1 DanceSport athletes may request a reduction in their class/proficiency level if they didn't compete during a period of one year.
- 1.3.8.2 DanceSport athletes may request a reduction in their class/proficiency level if they didn't advance to the next round and didn't earn any Placement or Champion or Superior proficiency points during a period of one year.
- 1.3.8.3 DanceSport athletes may request a reduction in their class/proficiency level if they participated, but didn't advance to the next round and didn't earn any Placement or Champion or Superior proficiency points at twelve (12) consecutive competitions. All events held during the same competition are counted as one competition.
- 1.3.8.4 After the class reduction the athlete will be assigned the required Minimum Number of Points in Each Dance (see 1.3.4). The athlete can request to be assigned zero points.

1.3.9 Centralized Tracking of the awarded points

- 1.3.9.1 Proficiency points are calculated and tracked only for registered USA Dance members.
- 1.3.9.2 Proficiency points earned by each dancer during the competition will be applied to the centralized database after the competition.
- 1.3.9.3 All dancers who exceed the maximum for the current level will be automatically leveled up. It is sole responsibility of the athlete to be aware of the current class in each style and eligibility to participate in proficiency events.

- Mixed Class 4-dance event. 23 couples total. 12 couples of E-class and 11 couples of D-class. The event has ¼, ½ and Final rounds. The couple became 3rd overall and in D-class. There are two other D-class couples in front and 8 D-class couples behind this couple. There are no E-class couples in front and E-class couples outplaced by this couple are not counted toward this couple's result.
 - The couple has earned 3 Progressive Points for each round and $11 - 3 = 8$ Placement Points. Total is 11 points for each dance which go toward accumulated sum of each dance, but it is not shown in the chart.
 - The final number of Proficiency Points for this event is $11 \times 4 = 44$. These points go toward Standard. It was the couple's first proficiency competition in D-class, so the accumulated sum in Standard is 44.
 - An accumulated sum for each dance is tracked by centralized database only. The accumulated sums by dances became: W-11, T-11, V-11, Q-11
- Single Class 4-dance event. 16 couples of D-class. The event has ¼, ½ and Final rounds. The couple became 1st overall and in D-class.
 - The couple has earned 3 Progressive Points for each round, 1 Champion Point and $12 - 1 = 11$ Placement Points. Total is 15 points for each dance.
 - The final number of Proficiency Points for this event is $15 \times 4 = 60$. These points go toward Standard and that makes the current accumulated sum 104 points.
 - The accumulated sums by dances became: W-26, T-26, V-26, Q-26.
- Mixed Class 1-dance Waltz event. 11 couples total. 9 couples of D-class and 2 couples of C-class. The event has ½ and Final rounds. The couple became 3rd overall and 1st among D-class couples. The C-class couples became 1st and 2nd overall.
 - The couple has earned 2 Progressive Points for each round, 1 Champion Point and $9 - 1 = 8$ Placement Points. Total is 11 points for Waltz.
 - The final number of Proficiency Points for this event is $11 \times 1 = 11$. These points go toward Standard and that makes the current accumulated sum 115 points.
 - The accumulated sums by dances became: W-37, T-26, V-26, Q-26. It means this dancer met the requirements for the Minimum Number of Points for Each Dance (1.3.4)
- Mixed Class 1-dance Tango event. 11 couples total. 9 couples of D-class and 2 couples of C-class. The event has ½ and Final rounds. The couple became 4th overall and 2nd among D-class couples. The C-class couples became 1st and 2nd overall.
 - The couple has earned 2 Progressive Points for each round and $9 - 2 = 7$ Placement Points. Total is 9 points for Tango.
 - The final number of Proficiency Points for this event is $9 \times 1 = 9$. These points go toward Standard and that makes the current accumulated sum 124 points.
 - The accumulated sums by dances became: W-37, T-35, V-26, Q-26.
- Mixed Class 1-dance Viennese Waltz event. 11 couples total. 9 couples of D-class and 2 couples of C-class. The event has ½ and Final rounds. The couple became 2nd overall and 1st among D-class couples. The C-class couples became 1st and 3rd overall.
 - The couple has earned 2 Progressive Points for each round, 1 Champion Point, 1 Superior Point for outplacing one couple of one class higher level and $10 - 1 = 9$ Placement Points. Total is 13 points for Viennese Waltz.
 - The final number of Proficiency Points for this event is $13 \times 1 = 13$. These points go toward Standard and that makes the current accumulated sum 137 points.
 - The accumulated sums by dances became: W-37, T-35, V-39, Q-26.

6. Mixed Class 1-dance Quickstep event. 11 couples total. 9 couples of D-class and 2 couples of C-class. The event has $\frac{1}{2}$ and Final rounds. The couple became 3rd overall and 1st among D-class couples. The C-class couples became 1st and 2nd overall.
- The calculation is the same as for Waltz (3)
 - 11 points go toward Standard and that makes the current accumulated sum 149 points.
 - The accumulated sums by dances became: W-37, T-35, V-39, Q-37.
7. Mixed Class 8-dance event. 35 couples total. 22 couples of E-class and 13 couples of D-class. The event has 1/8, $\frac{1}{4}$, $\frac{1}{2}$ and Final rounds. The couple became 1st overall and in D-class.
- The couple has earned 8 Progressive Points for each round in Two Style event, 1 Champion Point and 12 – 1 = 11 Placement Points. Total is 20 points for each dance.
 - The final number of Proficiency Points for this event is $20 \times 4 = 80$ in Standard and $20 \times 4 = 80$ in Latin.
 - The accumulated sums by dances became: ST: W-57, T-55, V-59, Q-57; LT: S-20, C-20, R,-20, J-20.
 - The athlete has exceeded the Minimum Number of points required to move from D to C class in Standard and became eligible to apply for C-class.
