## NOTES FROM THE BOARD

- There is about \$4200 in the Treasury.
- We'll be using a photographer on a trial basis at the March 4th dance. There is an opportunity for fund raising with part of photo receipts benefitting USABDA-MN.
- We're developing a USABDA-MN pin for fund raising purposes. There will be further discussion regarding design and implementation plan.
- The board is actively seeking corporate sponsorship to cover the expenses of certain programs, such as the sound system, youth programs, formation teams, etc.
- The Open level formation team will hold a benefit dance on April 1. Proceeds will go toward costumes for the team.
- A request for USABDA-MN funds for the Silver formation team is tabled until other fund raising options become available.
- A core team of directors will meet to continue the process of writing the job descriptions for all of the positions in the organization.
- The board voted to temporarily lift membership requirements for U of M students who want to participate in dance demos. Certain restrictions apply.
- Since ticket drawing for youth was so successful at TCO, we will be doing the same with MN Open.
- Normandale contacted David Schmit about the possibility of hosting a dance there. More to follow.
- The next board meeting will be held Tuesday, March 7, 7pm at Dunwoody Institute.

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# TWIN CITIES OPEN BALLROOM DANCE COMPETITION

Every year the TWIN CITIES OPEN BALLROOM DANCE COMPETITION proves to be one of the most well received ballroom competitions in the Midwest that is sanctioned by the National Dance Council of America. This year was no execption. With over 800 entries, the Twin Cities Open was packed with exciting competition and incredible dancing at all levels. Although most competitors came from the Twin Cities area, it was great to see dancers here from Nashville, Phoenix, St. Petersburg, Eau Claire and Milwaukee!

The Minneapolis Convention Center was a great venue for the competition. With capacity crowds both Friday and Saturday evenings, everyone enjoyed fabulous dancing and two spectacular shows by the current United States Ten-Dance Champions, Gary and Diana Mc Donald. Gary and Diana are clearly the most exciting dance team on the circuit today and disappointed no one in their entertaining show that demonstrated both International and American Styles of ballroom and latin dancing.

As always, organizers Amy Anderson and Mary Hartell hired a distinguished panel of Judges including Kerry Wilson (Canada); Perri Adair-Johnson (Florida); Patrick Johnson (Florida); Pete Taylor (Delaware); Judi Hatton (Florida); Leroy Walters (Kansas); and Gary and Diana Mc Donald (New Jersey).

Some of the highlights of the weekend competition included the presentation of the "Unforgettable Award," which salutes someone who has consistently supported ballroom dancing in the Midwest. Past recipients are Marcella Groh and Oliver Shader. This year it went to Mary Quinlan who has been a delight on the dance floor with her wonderful smile and entertaining style that has enchanted us for years. In addition to the Unforgettable Award, the "Team Match" was great fun and a very close competition with first place honors going to the Coliseum Ballroom, who also took the Top Studio Award for the competition.

The professional competition included some of the best dancers and champions in the country. Representing the International Modern were Tim and Michelle Mason who are currently in the Top Six in the country. Representing the American Smooth were Jim and Jenell Maranto who are the current and two-time U.S. American Smooth Champions. Representing both Theatre Arts and American Rhythm were our own Robert and Jennifer Foster, who are finalists in both styles. In addition, the current U.S. Nine-dance Champions, Jesse Smith and Lynda Price, also from Minneapolis, danced in true champion form in both the American Smooth and Rhythm.

# President's Corner

After stepping back and looking at the over-all picture of ballroom dancing in the Twin Cities, and looking for ways USABDA and ballroom dancing can expand, I've come to this conclusion:

Ballroom Dancing is for **everyone**, and we <u>must</u> look at what we can do to create an inviting atmosphere for beginners and novice dancers.

We've created dances that are enjoyable for the intermediate and advanced dancers-- and we need to continue to improve on them. We know what our members like, and they come first.

What we need to address is how to <u>really</u> grow. In order to attract a larger percentage of the new people who check out ballroom dancing, they need to feel comfortable with dancing at the level they're at. Sure, they need to observe and even get a chance to dance with more advanced dancers. It takes a lot of time, desire and determination for most people to get to that level and we need to do what we can to support the beginners.

Think back to when you first started, and you'll come up with all sorts of ideas for helping newcorners to learn to dance. As we all know, it takes the men longer to progress, because they not only have to learn *how* to dance, but how to *lead* as well. That's why there's usually a shortage of men! But once a man is able to lead well, he can get beginners to follow steps they've never tried before.

I'd like to propose a USABDA dance for beginners, and have it run by newer USABDA members who are not already busy helping in other ways. The USABDA-MN Board would oversee the dance, just to keep the high quality of dances that we've grown accustomed to. More than one lesson could be taught during the dance to make it a good learning experience. Dance etiquette and floor craft could also be taught and monitored. Several mixers are an option. Advanced dancers would be encouraged to come and help the beginners, but only if they are willing to dance with the beginners and help them catch on.

Call or write to me with your thoughts on this. If there is enought interest we'll put it on the agenda for our next board meeting, Tuesday, March 7th.

## **PROFESSIONAL PROFILE** FOCUS ON TWIN CITIES INSTRUCTORS

## -TRACY HEINZE-

Tracy has been a familiar face in the Twin Cities professional dance community since 1990, but her love of dance started years ago. She began at age 14, and went on to pursue a Bachelor of Arts degree in Dance from the College of St. Teresa in Winona. After graduation and a move to the Twin Cities, Tracy apprenticed with the Nancy Hauser Dance Company for two years. They perform a variety of styles, including folk, ballet and modern.

Tracy's first real exposure to ballroom dancing came about from watching a competition on public television. From that day forward, her focus was forever changed. She found the technical aspect of ballroom dance fascinating and without the critical opinions reflected in the more creative-movement types of dance.

The Dancers Studio has been her home since 1990, where she started training as an instructor, and now teaches full-time. Her specialty is smooth, although she continues to train in rhythm and latin. She also sells ballroom dance shoes, representing two, soon to be three lines.

As with all dancers Tracy *does* have a life outside the studio. She and her husband, Vern, have a house and two roommates: Buster and Pepper, two lively dogs acquired from the local animal shelter. Tracy and Vern also have a love of collector cars, owning both a '71 Corvette and a '67 Chevelle. And, in case you're wondering, Vern does do a bit of ballroom-- but leaves some of the leading to his other half!

Tracy considers ballroom dancing to be unequaled in its appeal... "The purpose is social-- to get together and have a good time. When I see students laughing or smiling as they move around the floor, it makes my spirit soar." Soar away, Tracy.

## USABDA PROFILE FOCUS ON USABDA MEMBERS

## -DOUG LUSHER-

Originally from southern Michigan, Doug attended Spring Arbor, a small liberal arts college. After a short stay in California, he moved to the Twin Cities, after his parents moved here in the 80's.

Doug's interest in ballroom dancing is sort of one of those evolutionary things, starting in square dancing, then round dancing and finally ballroom. There is a connection...

After square dancing awhile, he was introduced to round dancing, which, as it was explained, is something of a cross between square and ballroom. Dancing is done in pairs, and there are steps and patterns, some very similar to ballroom. At the dances, a caller calls out the patterns, and everyone dances around the floor to whatever patterns are called-- similar to square dancing. There isn't much round dancing locally, so afficionados travel if they want to participate. Doug started ballroom dance lessons at The Dancers Studio and has taken most of his lessons there.

Other interests include programming computers, sailing, antiques and the outdoors. Some day he hopes to buy a few acres of rolling terrain in western Wisconsin. When not dancing or doing one of these activities, Doug works at United Parcel Service.

Doug is probably USABDA's *Mr. Formation*, participating in all <u>three</u> of USABDA's formation teams: Open, Silver and Latin. Doug's forte in dance is smooth, and he favors the quickstep. But he also does a *mean* west coast swing--specializing in, who was it, Mickey Mouse? Doug, can we have a repeat performance?
