VERONIKA KEDROŇOVÁ NAMED RECIPIENT OF THE 2026 EDITH CUMMINGS MUNSON GOLF AWARD

FRISCO, Texas (July 28, 2026) – Kent State University Junior, Veronika Kedroňová has been named the recipient of the 2026 Edith Cummings Munson Golf Award.

The award is presented annually for Women's Division I Golf and goes to the student-athlete who is an upperclassman and both a WGCA All-American Scholar and a WGCA All-American. If more than one student-athlete qualifies, the student-athlete with the highest GPA receives the award. A donation of \$10,000 is given from the Curtis & Edith Cummings Munson Foundation to the general scholarship fund of the recipient's institution.



Previous winners of this award include Leona Maguire (2017 and 2018), Chiara Tamburlini (2022), Laney Frye (2023), and Louise Rydqvist (2024 and 2025).

Veronika Kedroňová had a fantastic third-year at Kent State. She finished the season ranked #22 with an adjusted scoring average of 70.0. Veronika was a 2026 WGCA Second Team All-American and a member of the WGCA All-American Scholar Team. She notched four wins – Canadian Collegiate Invitational, Landfall Tradition, Lady Luck Invitational, and MAC Women's Golf Championships. Kedroňová was named a 2026 CSC Academic All-American and a Golfweek All-American Second Team selection. Within the MAC Conference, she repeated as the MAC Golfer of the Year and made the All-MAC First Team.

A three-time WGCA All-American Scholar, Kedroňová finished her third year at Kent State with a 4.0 cumulative GPA as a finance major with a minor in accounting.
