### MIZUNO WGCA COACHES POLL RANKINGS ANNOUNCED

CORAL SPRINGS, Florida (March 15, 2024) – The Women's Golf Coaches Association (WGCA) has announced the results of the most recent Mizuno WGCA Coaches Poll. This is the second poll of the 2024 spring season.



In Division I, Stanford University jumps to the top spot after receiving
15 first-place votes, while Wake Forest University drops to No. 2 with three votes. University
of California, Los Angeles received one first-place vote to climb three spots to No. 3, while
University of South Carolina moves up one spot to No. 4. Rounding out the top-five is
Louisiana State University after jumping five spots.

Dallas Baptist University claims the top spot in Division II, receiving nine first-place votes to move up one spot, while Nova Southeastern University drops to No. 2 with two votes. Flagler College jumps three spots to No. 3, while University of Findlay drops one spot to No. 4. Anderson University (SC) holds steady at No. 5 after receiving one first-place vote.

Carnegie Mellon University climbs two spots to top the Division III rankings with four first-place votes, while Pomona-Pitzer received two votes to drop to No. 2. Williams College received five first-place votes to jump two spots to No. 3, while George Fox University falls to No. 4 with two votes. Emory University drops one spot to round out the top five.

In NAIA, the top three remains unchanged with University of British Columbia as the unanimous No. 1, followed by Keiser University and Oklahoma City University, respectively.

The next Mizuno WGCA Coaches Poll will be released on Friday, April 12.
