MIZUNO WGCA COACHES POLL RANKINGS ANNOUNCED

CORAL SPRINGS, Florida (May 3, 2024) – The Women's Golf Coaches Association (WGCA) has announced the results of the most recent Mizuno WGCA Coaches Poll. This is the fourth and final poll of the 2024 spring season.



In Division I, Stanford University remains at the top of the rankings after receiving all but one first-place vote, while University of South Carolina received the remaining vote to come in at No. 2. Wake Forest University and University of California, Los Angeles take the No. 3 and No. 4 spots, respectively, while Louisiana State University holds steady at No. 5.

Dallas Baptist University remains the unanimous No. 1 in Division II, while Flagler College holds steady to claim the No. 2 spot. University of Findlay remains at No. 3, while Texas A&M University jumps two spots to No. 4. Anderson University and Nova Southeastern University tie for the No. 5 spot.

Carnegie Mellon University remains atop the Division III rankings with eight first-place votes, while Pomona-Pitzer received one vote to hold steady at No. 2. George Fox University received one first-place vote to remain at No. 3, while Emory University climbs one spot to No. 4. Rounding out the top-five is Claremont-Mudd-Scripps, who received one first-place vote.

In NAIA, University of British Columbia remains No. 1 with all but one first-place vote, while Keiser University received the remaining vote to hold steady at No. 2. Oklahoma City University and SCAD Savannah tie for the No. 3 spot.
