Open Positions on the CPAE Executive Committee

Chair-elect. The duties of the chair are to call meetings of both the commission and the EC and to be the presiding officer at those meetings. The chair also represents CPAE on the AAACE Board of Directors. The chair will be elected to the position as chair-elect for one year and subsequently serve a two-year term as chair.

Secretary/Treasurer. The duties of the secretary/treasurer are to keep the minutes of commission and EC meetings; carry on general correspondence on behalf of the commission; keep a current list of the membership; send notices of all meetings; and be responsible for commission funds. The secretary/treasurer will also be responsible for submitting appropriate bills to AAACE for payment. The secretary/treasurer will be elected to the position for a two-year term, starting October 2019 and concluding October 2021.

Two Member-at-Large positions. This year's two newly elected members-at-large will serve a two-year term from October 2019 through October 2021.

If you are interested in being a nominee for any of the above positions, please send a brief paragraph on why you want to serve on the CPAE EC to Kalpana Gupta (kalpana.gupta@colostate.edu) no later than Monday, September 30. A list of nominees will be provided to CPAE membership for voting at the CPAE business meeting.

Additional nominees may be accepted from the floor during our business meeting. Prior to any voting, those nominees will have the opportunity to share a brief overview of why they are interested in serving on the CPAE EC.
