He is greatly involved in the design and implementation of the Independence at Home demonstration, a service delivery and payment incentive model that uses home-based primary care teams designed to improve health outcomes and reduce expenditures for Medicare beneficiaries with multiple chronic conditions

Dr. Kinoshian has been a longtime committed member to the Academy and his deep involvement with the organization has greatly impacted its growth. Dr. Kinoshian serves on the Public Policy Committee. He also is a Board Member of the Home Care Medicine Action Fund, a 501(c)4 organization which promotes legislative solutions to enhance the art and science of home care medicine.
