

**Data Collection Activities Survey Summary**  
**June, 2017**

The Data Collection Activities Survey was sent to the primary contact of all current AAOE member practices on June 7, 2017. A total of 221 practices participated in the survey.

**Patient Satisfaction Surveys**

61% of practices (n=215) reported that they are currently using a patient satisfaction survey.

35% of practices (n=201) reported that they are currently collecting patient reported outcomes.
