Outstanding Scholarly Publication Award



Jorge E. RamosGeorgetown University, Washington, D.C.



Christine Shea University of Iowa, Iowa City, IA

The AATSP Outstanding Scholarly Publication Award is given annually to an article published in *Hispania*. The focus of the award alternates on an annual basis. The focus for all odd-numbered years is literature, film, and culture while the focus for even-numbered years, such as this year, is linguistics and language science/pedagogy.

The 2024 Outstanding Scholarly Publication Award goes to Jorge E. Ramos, Georgetown University, and Christine Shea, University of Iowa. Their article, titled "Speaking Race or Racialized Speaking: Evidence from Perceptions of Lateral Variants by Puerto Rican Listeners" is freely available on the AATSP website.

The members of the Selection Committee recognized the essay as a fascinating, polished, well argued, and intriguing empirical approach examining the socio-phonetic dialect variants of [r] and [l] alternation in Spanish.

Unfortunately, the authors are unable to join us today.

The runner up for 2024's Outstanding Scholarly Publication Award is "Second Language Development of Dialect Awareness in Spanish" by Lauren B. Schmidt, San Diego State University, San Diego, CA.

As noted by the Selection Committee, the author's research sheds light on how dialects affect linguistic proficiency, but there are also other implications, such as the continued need for inclusion and diversity in what Spanish we are teaching.

Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Award



Alejandro LeeSanta Monica College, Santa Monica, CA

The AATSP Award for Excellence in Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion is a relatively new award sponsored by Klett World Languages. The award reflects AATSP's values to embrace diversity and strive for a more equitable, inclusive future, through language education.

Professor Alejandro Lee is the 2024 recipient of the AATSP Award for Excellence in Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI). Dr. Lee teaches Spanish at Santa Monica College, in Santa Monica, CA.

As noted in one of his letters of recommendation, Professor Lee's tireless advocacy for diversity, equity, and inclusion has been evident since the very beginning of his career, but it is clearly exemplified by his invaluable contributions to Open Educational Resources (OER). His authored readings on topics such as Spanish in the Philippine Islands, Equatorial Guinea, Perú Negro, the Chinese influence in the chifas in Peru, and the LGBT+ community have significantly enriched the learning experience for students.

Alejandro Lee writes:

Diversity, equity, inclusion, and accessibility have been important to me throughout my career, but it is in my current position at a community college that the need is more pronounced. Moreover, my advocacy for these tenets grew stronger when I began teaching heritage speakers of Spanish. At all levels of instruction, heritage language education requires a balance of equitable, yet fair, and inclusive practices in the curriculum.

Outstanding Service Award

The AATSP Outstanding Service Award is given to a member in good standing of the Association who has made outstanding service contributions to the Association, such as holding leadership positions within the AATSP and/or one of its chapters, serving as a chair or member of important AATSP committees, and representing the AATSP in a national or international capacity.

This year's recipient of the AATSP Outstanding Service Award is Hannah Rae Joseph, from Spain Park High School in Hoover, Alabama. Hannah has served as President of the Alabama Association of Teachers of Spanish and Portuguese and as a member of the Board of the Alabama World Language Association. Among her most impactful contributions to the teaching profession is her N.E.W.B.I.E project, an initiative which provides care packages to new language educators to help them feel welcomed and supported. Her recent expansion of the project to include partnerships with organizations in Illinois underscores her unwavering commitment to supporting educators across the nation. Hannah's work is a powerful reminder of the transformative impact that service can have in creating positive change within our communities.

Victoria writes:

As a teacher for over thirty-five years, I continue to learn every day from my students and colleagues. My students respond to input provided with their uptake and, eventually, their output. When I see them willing to stretch their language skills by relying on context clues, asking for expressions they need or listening closely to pick up new words from a more advanced speaker, I admire their ability to take risks and feel grateful that the design of the learning environment has been successful.

AATSP Teacher of the Year Award Secondary Level (9-12)

Dr. Lisa DaCunha Machnik is the 2024 recipient of the AATSP Teacher of the Year Award for the Secondary Level (9-12). Dr. DaCunha Machnik teaches Portuguese and Spanish at Somerville Public Schools in Somerville, MA.

As noted in one of her letters of recommendation for this award: Within the last few years, Massachusetts has adopted progressive world language standards that center social justice. Dr. Machnik has been very proactive in incorporating them. She provides first class professional development for her teachers, regularly attends conference like AATSP, considers policies that need to be address, such as their Honors Program, and contributes to the field as a frequent presenter.

Lisa writes:

As a teacher and as the K-12 World Language Supervisor, I believe that all students should have equitable access to our language program and that all students can learn with the appropriate support and level of rigor. I believe in giving students voice and choice. I believe in multilingualism and foster this belief by overseeing the district's Seal of Biliteracy award. In our department we are committed to exploring multicultural perspectives, especially of less commonly taught cultures in the languages we teach. AATSP Teacher of the Year Award Four-Year College/University Level



Carmen Ramos Méndez

International University of Applied Languages, Munich, Germany

Professor Carmen Ramos Méndez is the 2024 recipient of the AATSP Teacher of the Year Award for the Higher Education level. Dr. Ramos Méndez teaches Spanish at the International University of Applied Languages (SDI München) in Munich, Germany.

As noted by the President of her University: *Professor Ramos has significantly contributed to the development and implementation of a pioneering MA program in Teaching Spanish as a Foreign Language, which stands out in Europe for its unique specialization modules... Her initiative in organizing online symposiums each semester for students and faculty showcases her forward-thinking approach, incorporating topics such as artificial intelligence in language teaching and professional use of social media.*

Carmen writes:

Honorary Fellows Award



Ondjaki (Ndalu de Almeida) Luanda, Angola

The AATSP's Honorary Fellow Award honors individuals who have distinguished themselves and received recognition for outstanding services or contributions in the field of Hispanic and Luso-Brazilian languages, literatures, cultures, linguistics, and cinema.

This year's recipient of the Honorary Fellows Award is Angolan writer Ondjaki. Ondjaki is the pen name of Angolan author Ndalu de Almeida (b. 1977). With over 20 books, Ondjaki's body of work is extensive and varied, and includes novels, collections of short stories, poems, film scripts, and children's literature. He has won important literary prizes, including Portugal's José Saramago Award for his 2013 book *Os Transparentes*, and Brazil's Jabuti Prize for Best Book in Foreign Literature (FNLIJ, 2023) for *O livro do deslembramento*.

Celebrating the richness of Angolan Portuguese, Ondjaki writes:

I was born into a Portuguese language which was, and is, Angolan. But many Portuguese languages exist in Angola. It's not just the difference between Luanda and other places. The way of speaking varies according to social class, also, or according to place, or according to the personal interpretation that each person makes of their language. The Portuguese language in Angola, whether used by a citizen in daily life, by a child, by a woman who sells things in the street, by a sea-shell seller, a politician or a writer, is a singular instrument of self-expression and creation. It's even each person's private theatre.

Mario Vargas Llosa Sigma Delta Pi and AATSP Joint Award

The Mario Vargas Llosa Award is a joint award of Sigma Delta Pi, the National Collegiate Hispanic Honor Society, and the AATSP. Lawrence Wilkins Founder's Award
