

More activities and ideas!

- Have students write their own version of the poem "Bilingüe" by Alma Flor Ada.
- Have students investigate messages transmitted in different murales around the country: Un mural dice más de mil palabras (Pilsen, Chicago, Little Havana, Miami, Melrose Ave., Los Angeles, CA. etc.).
- Have students explore and discuss the works of lesser-known Spanish-speaking artists, like Santiago Savi (Mexico) or Cecilia Vicuña (Chile).
- Start a <u>Sociedad Honoraria Hispánica chapter</u> for students grades 10-12 at your school if you don't yet have one.
- Start a <u>Sociedad Hispánica de Amistad</u> chapter for students grades K-9 at your school if you don't yet have one.
- Plan to hold a Sociedad Honoraria Hispanic <u>induction ceremony</u> if you were unable to do so. Here are <u>samples</u> if you need to hold it virtually and here are <u>reasons to do it in the fall</u> if you traditionally have done it in the spring.
- Start a new philanthropy project with your Spanish students. Here is a <u>list of possible</u> <u>organizations</u> that have worked with Sociedad Honoraria Hispánica chapters in the past.
- Make door decorations for each department in your school that recognizes the work of Latinx individuals in these different disciplines.
- Have your students make muñecas guitapenas:

 - Enjoy this Guatemalan "Quitapenas" Dolls from the _____ Chapter of the Spanish Honor Society

- Have your Sociedad Honoraria Hispánica students work on art, poetry, prose or <u>multimedia works</u> for submission to <u>Albricias</u>, the student literary journal of the Sociedad. Next theme: *los derechos humanos*. Deadline: December 1, 2021.
