



Call for Papers

August 15 – December 31, 2018

Health Promotion Practice seeks to curate a body of important papers in 2019 that address critical issues of our time and advance knowledge, skills, and advocacy for public health. We hope that this call will yield papers that will be published in HPP online and in print throughout the coming year.

In addition to the ongoing, open call for manuscripts, HPP's editorial board especially welcomes submissions of evidence-based and/or conceptually grounded scholarship in the following areas:

- Interventions addressing the intersectionality of social determinants and lived experience of diseases of despair and power imbalance, including adult suicide, opioid addiction and overdose, mental health and depression, and both interpersonal and community violence;
- Case studies or assessments of community responsiveness, resilience, advocacy, and critical reflexivity in the context of geopolitical shifts, changing demographics, structured inequity, or environmental challenges;
- Innovative applications of telling a story to impact policy and environments for health, such as data visualization, photovoice, participatory mapping, digital storytelling;
- Insights from practice and research regarding the impact and potential implications of migration policies and practices on individuals, families, and/or communities, and the demonstrated contribution of use and application of health promotion principles and methods in understanding and addressing adverse childhood experiences, trauma, and healing;
- Systems and environmental approaches that have scaled healthy eating, active living programs into sustainable community designs and policy changes at multiple levels of practice including clinical, school, community and household;
- Translation and use of epigenetics, epidemiology, environmental health and policy to promote health and changes in behavior at the individual, community and organizational levels;
- Evidence-based reports of strategies and interventions that develop leadership, nurture confidence and build collective efficacy and effectiveness as integral parts of health promotion practice.

SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS

HPP will accept manuscripts in response to this call between August 15 and December 31, 2018. Please follow the journal's submission guidelines [<http://journals.sagepub.com/home/hpp>], **noting in the cover letter that you are responding to HPP's 2018 Call for Papers**. There is no fee for submitting a manuscript.

Manuscripts submitted in response to the call for papers will be reviewed as they are received, with first decision within 3 weeks. All submitted manuscripts will undergo standard peer review by the HPP editors and peer referees, as defined by HPP policy. ANTICIPATED PUBLICATION

Papers will be published online within 8 weeks of final acceptance decision, with print publication to follow within the next 6 months.
