MEET OUR KEYNOTE SPEAKERS



JENNIFER EVANS-COWLEY, PHD, AICP

Provost & Vice President for Academic Affairs, University of North Texas

Jennifer Evans-Cowley, is the Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs at the University of North Texas. As provost she leads one of the nation's largest and most diverse Carnegie Tier 1 public research universities educating more than 38,000 students through a broad and balanced array of 221 academic programs. The education of these students is through the efforts of more than 1,500 faculty and 1,200 academic staff.

Prior to becoming provost at UNT in 2017, Cowley served the Ohio State University for more than 15 years. Cowley became the first female to lead the city and regional planning program, building a new bachelor's degree. And then went on to lead the College of Engineering's growth as Associate Dean of Academic Affairs and Administration for the College of Engineering where she oversaw faculty affairs, facilities, institutional research and information technology. Most recently she served as the Vice Provost for Capital Planning and Regional Campuses leading the University's \$1 Billion capital plan, providing quality facilities - advancing academics and the university's support units. She is leading the university's visioning for the university's regional campuses at Lima, Mansfield, Marion and Newark, which serve more than 6,000 students through the access and affordability mission of the university.



MICHAEL GOH, PHD

Vice President for Equity & Diversity, University of Minnesota

Michael Goh, PhD is Vice President for Equity and Diversity for the University of Minnesota 5-campus system. He is also a professor in the Department of Organizational Leadership, Policy, and Development in the College of Education and Human Development (CEHD) and affiliated with the Interdisciplinary Center for the Study of Global Change. Dr. Goh is a PhD graduate from the Counseling and Student Personnel Psychology program and his combined twenty-four years as a student, faculty, and senior administrator at the University of Minnesota have given him deep and nuanced insights on what it takes to achieve inclusive excellence on our campuses. For this reason, Dr. Goh was invited in 2014 to serve as the university's associate vice provost for equity and diversity. In that capacity, he was instrumental in promoting and supporting the recruitment and retention of diverse faculty to our campuses. Dr. Goh's focus on multicultural counseling, intercultural competence, and cultural intelligence brings an interdisciplinary lens to equity, diversity, and inclusion issues in higher education as well as the unique skills vital for his key senior leadership position.

In 2015, Dr. Goh was one of six professors on campus appointed Generation Next – Urban Research Outreach –Engagement Center (GenNext-UROC) fellows and tasked to study socio-cultural explanations for educational equity gaps in Minnesota. Dr. Goh is passionate about multicultural education and mentoring students to succeed in higher education. Dr. Goh's teaching, research, and service are focused on discovering better ways to conceptualize, assess, and ultimately teach intercultural competence in order to improve access to mental health services for underserved populations.



ALENE TCHOURUMOFF

**Senior Vice President of Community Development & Center for Indian Country Development
Federal Reserve Bank of Minneapolis**

Alene Tchourumoff is Senior Vice President of Community Development and Center for Indian Country Development at the Federal Reserve Bank of Minneapolis. In this role, she leads the Bank's strategies for engaging communities throughout the Ninth District with emphasis on low and moderate income populations and Indian Country. Most recently, Alene served as Chair of the Metropolitan Council, where she focused on building strong partnerships with local governments and community groups to advance transit, housing, and other critical infrastructure within the metro region. Previously, Governor Mark Dayton appointed her Minnesota's first State Rail Director, and, from 2013 to 2016, she led the Planning Department for Hennepin County Public Works. Prior to her work at Hennepin County, Alene filled management and advisory roles focusing on infrastructure, planning and finance, in addition to serving as Agricultural Development Advisor to the World Bank. Alene holds a Bachelor's Degree in Business Administration from George Washington University School of Business, and a Master's Degree in Public Policy from Harvard University's Kennedy School of Government.
