

Eligibility for “Low Resourced Country” ACSP Conference Registration

- Eligibility is based on the **location of your home institution**, not on your temporary residence or guest institution.
- If your home country is listed below, you qualify for ACSP’s low-resourced country registration.
- The list below is determined by the World Bank, not the ACSP. ACSP updates this list of countries on an annual basis. Read more about the [World Bank's country classification method](#).
- The ACSP uses two of the World Bank's Income Groups [found on this page](#) (scroll to the economies list closer to the bottom). For Fiscal Year 2027 calculated using the [World Bank Atlas method](#):
 - Low-income economies are defined as those with a GNI per capita of \$1,175 or less in 2025.
 - Lower middle-income economies are those with a GNI per capita between \$1,176 and \$4,635 in 2025.
