RISING STAR AWARD

Shumaker Transcription Service has successfully incorporated support of their staff that aligns very nicely with AHDI's 4 strategic goals. For example, Shumaker Transcription Service covers their employee's AHDI membership fees, supplies Benchmark KB to their staff, and financially supports credentialing by reimbursing exam costs upon successful completion and a salary differential for CMTs. Furthermore, the company has promoted the association's advocacy

program by organizing their MTs to visit their representative's local office to discuss the impact of EHRs on healthcare.
