

BEHAVIORAL THREAT ASSESSMENT MANAGEMENT



Behavioral Threat Assessment Management (BTAM) is a process for investigating, assessing, and managing behaviors to prevent or manage targeted violence. This training and the accompanying pre-requisites will prepare healthcare emergency managers to participate in and/or begin the formation of a BTAM team. The training will include lecture, case-studies, and interactive discussions, designed to provide participants with a strong base for participating in or creating BTAM teams.

This training is NOT about patient management. Rather, it is about threats of targeted violence posed from disgruntled employees, angry family members, abusive spouses and others.

The training is approximately six hours.

This training is funded by the Department of Homeland Security's Center for Prevention Programs and Partnerships (CP3) and is provided at no cost for instruction by Poydras Home, the Association of Healthcare Emergency Preparedness Professionals, and the University of Nebraska Medical Center. A small fee is assessed solely to offset the cost of food and refreshments.
