Educators in the AIMS community are galvanized around responding thoughtfully to current events. There is a free [White Educators Community Gathering today-- Monday--at 7:30pm](#) via Zoom. It is going to be led by AIMS educator Rodney Glasgow's group and will include panelists like Jen Cort,



John Gentile, Savi Tuber and Caitlin Sweetlamb. Tomorrow, Tuesday, AIMS is offering another free webinar, [And Here We Are...Again: Race, Remote Learning, and our Responsibility](#) at 3:00 for all AIMS and AISGW educators. It is being led by Samantha Fletcher, Jonathan Fichter and Pat Harden. It focuses on what we can be doing NOW.

Finally, [The Wells Collective](#), a group comprised of several female AIMS educators of color, is offering two different options. **Teaching, Loving and Believing in Black Girls** is a free 1.5 hour Zoom meeting on June 17th, focusing on research surrounding black girls in a classroom setting, as well as strategies that can be implemented in the classroom to center black girls' voices. They'll follow that with a three-week (once per week) zoom meeting series entitled **Little Fires Everywhere**, which focuses relationships between black women and white women.
