RE: Underhousing and Homelessness

On behalf of the Association of Local Public Health Agencies (alPHa) and its Boards of Health Section, Council of Ontario Medical Officers of Health Section, and our Affiliate organizations, I am writing to you with many thanks as well as to highlight where our current advocacy work aligns.

I would like to first thank you for the warm and productive discussion we had at the Rural Ontario Municipal Association (ROMA) Conference on Sunday, January 18, 2025, with Loretta Ryan, Chief Executive Officer, alPHa and your staff. We know how busy the ROMA conference would have been, and it is genuinely appreciated that you made time for this meeting. We would also like to thank you for your welcoming remarks at the alPHa Winter Symposium on Friday, February 14, 2025. These were well-received and resonated well with alPHa's members.

Congratulations to the Association of Municipalities of Ontario (AMO) on the release of the report: *Municipalities Under Pressure: The Human and Financial Costs of Ontario's Homelessness Crisis*. It is a well-researched compelling report that received a great degree of positive press, and we have distributed these to the alPHa membership via our monthly newsletter, *Information Break*. alPHa shares AMO's vision where homelessness is rare, brief, non-recurring, and achievable through targeted investments in sustainable solutions. AMO staff made an excellent presentation on this report at the Board of Health section session at alPHa's Winter Symposium's on February 14th.

alPHa reaffirms its steadfast support for multisectoral strategies aimed at addressing underhousing and homelessness in Ontario. AMO's paper aligns with our perspective on the matter, as well as with the specific recommendations set forth in our Resolution - Resolution A23-4 - Ending Underhousing and Homelessness in Ontario (attached), that itself was based on AMO's 2023 *Call to Action on Housing and Homelessness*.

In this Resolution, our members formally recognized underhousing and homelessness as a public health crisis impacting all regions of Ontario and emphasizing public health's role in contributing to a broad range of housing, social services, and health solutions through collaboration with multiple stakeholders. In our Resolution, we respectfully urged the provincial government to consider the following actions:

- Acknowledge that housing is both a social determinant of health and a fundamental human right.
- Recognize that homelessness in Ontario is a complex social, economic, and health crisis.
- Commit to the goal of ending underhousing and homelessness in Ontario.

Collaborate with alPHa, AMO, and a wide range of community, health, Indigenous, and
economic partners to develop, resource, and implement an actionable plan to achieve this
objective.

alPHa continues to value AMO and alPHa's long-standing close relationship and remains committed to working alongside AMO, the municipal sector and our other key partners, to address this pressing issue in a holistic and sustainable manner. We look forward to our continued collaboration to foster a strong, sustainable, resilient, and locally based public health system in Ontario. RESOLUTION A23-04

TITLE: Ending Underhousing and Homelessness in Ontario

SPONSOR: alPHa Boards of Health Section

WHEREAS housing is recognized as a human right in Canada under the International Covenant on

Economic, Social and Cultural Rights 1; and

WHEREAS the goal of Public Health is to reduce health inequities and improve the health of

the whole population; and

WHEREAS housing is widely accepted as a key determinant of health, with the health of a

population directly linked with the availability of adequate, affordable housing; and

WHEREAS the negative impacts of housing insecurity and homelessness include poor mental health,

higher risk of infectious diseases, higher risk of chronic diseases, and higher risk of

injuries among others ²; and

WHEREAS ending underhousing and homelessness requires a range of housing, social service, and

health solutions from a range of stakeholders; and

WHEREAS leadership and urgent action is needed from the provincial government on an

emergency basis to develop, resource, and implement a comprehensive plan to prevent,

reduce and ultimately end underhousing and homelessness in Ontario; and

WHEREAS The Association of Municipalities of Ontario, a strategic partner of alPHa has asked that

their partners support their Call to Action on Housing and Homelessness;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT alPHa support AMO's *Call to Action on Housing and Homelessness*;

AND FURTHER THAT alPHa call on the Provincial Government to:

- acknowledge that housing is a social determinant of health and a human right.
- acknowledge that homelessness in Ontario is a social, economic, and health crisis.
- commit to the goal of ending underhousing and homelessness in Ontario.
- work with alPHa, AMO and a broad range of community, health, Indigenous and economic partners to develop, resource, and implement an action plan to achieve this goal.

AND FURTHER THAT the Association of Municipalities of Ontario and the Ministers of Health; Municipal Affairs and Housing; Ministry of Finance; the Premier's office; relevant ministries of the Federal Government; and Children, Community and Social Services be so advised.
