President & Executive Director's Report

Public health has seldom been in the public eye more than it is right now. In a time of COVID-19, alPHa's role as the voice of Ontario's public health system has never been more important.

alPHa informs provincial and municipal politicians and stakeholders about the importance of public health, promotes an understanding of the key role that local public health plays in communities, and reinforces the value of the work of our members. alPHa is at the forefront of many key public health issues. In addition to many deputations and speeches along with more than 40 submissions to government over the past year, alPHa has provided substantial input on the response to COVID-19 and Public Health Modernization.

As part of alPHa's leadership role, the association maintains strong relationships with provincial partners such as Public Health Ontario, the Office of the Chief Medical Officer of Health, and the Ministry of Health. Activities over the last year have included meetings with the Minister of Health and other key decision-makers where alPHa provides input and has an impact on issues of importance to our members. alPHa participates in key stakeholder groups and is an active member of the Ontario Chronic Disease Prevention Alliance, Ontario Health Providers Alliance and the Association of Municipalities of Ontario (AMO) Health Task Force.

alPHa will continue to keep vital information flowing to and among its members to provide information and analysis on many key pieces of legislation and shares this through our website, email, newsletter *Information Break*, and on social media via alPHa's Twitter account: @PHAgencies and LinkedIn page.

alPHa provides for members educational and development opportunities to support local public health leadership, management and governance through the annual conference, symposiums, and face-to-face and virtual meetings. These continuous professional learning opportunities increase our members' knowledge on public health issues, programs and services. Over the past year, alPHa held three very well-attended successful events – alPHa's Annual Conference in Kingston, June 2019, Symposiums in November 2019 and February 2020, and Boards of Health and Council of Ontario Medical Officers of Health Section meetings (June 2019, November 2019 and February 2020). alPHa would like to thank the staff and volunteers at KFL&A Public Health for their outstanding work on the Conference. alPHa would also like to thank the University of Toronto's Dalla Lana School of Public Health for partnering on the November Symposium.

Thank you to all of our members for supporting alPHa. We would especially like to thank the 2019-2020 Board of Directors, Boards of Health Section Chair Trudy Sachowski and the Chair of the Council of Ontario Medical Officers of Health, Dr. Paul Roumeliotis, committee members, working group members and our many other volunteers. alPHa could simply not have done what it did over the past year without their many contributions and their outstanding leadership. Thank you also to the alPHa staff who worked hard over the past year and continued to provide exceptional service to the members.
