Course Description

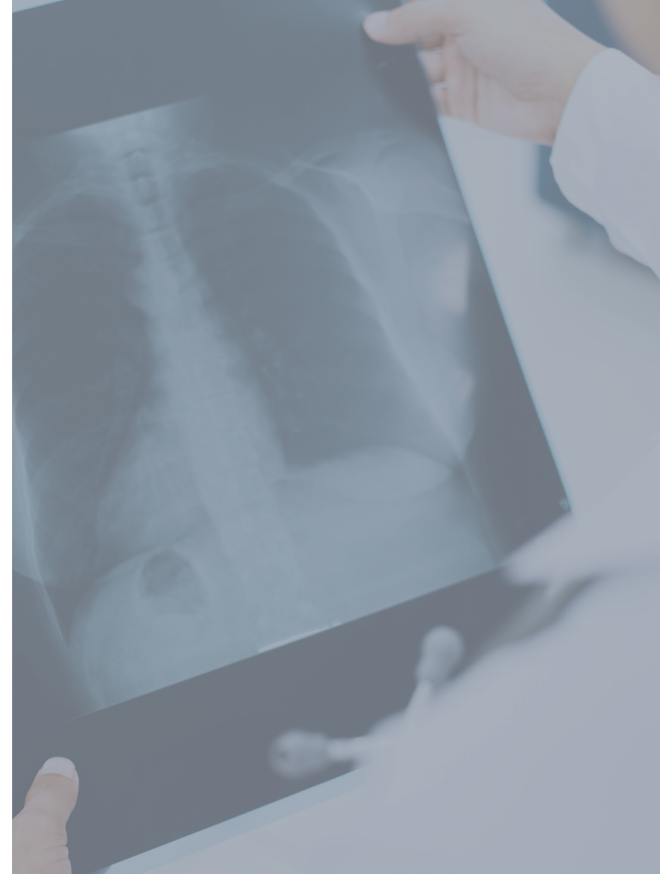

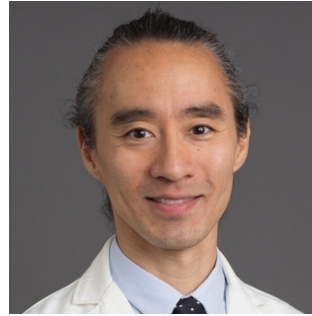

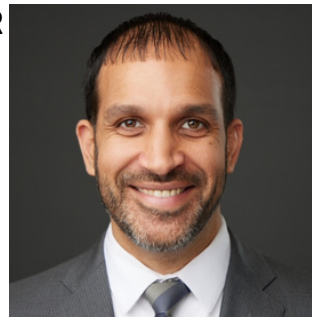
