Course Description

The course is designed to focus on cases and pathologies encountered on a daily basis by radiologists across all subspecialties. Not only do radiologists encounter questions about imaging protocols but often serve as a consult for next steps in management whether they are in the acute inpatient setting or outpatient setting. During these four days, course attendees will be updated on imaging advances, review imaging guidelines and procedures where applicable, and develop strategies in interpreting challenging cases.

- Review current imaging techniques and procedures used in inpatient and outpatient settings across all subspecialties
- Discuss common acute imaging findings and imaging patterns, in both the inpatient and outpatient setting, across all subspecialties
- Present practical diagnostic approach to outpatient cancer imaging and the impact of the radiologist roles
