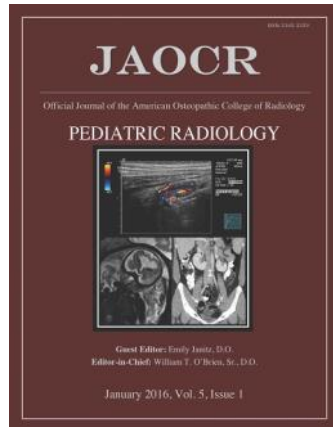

The group of topics chosen highlights the diversity of pediatric radiology as a subspecialty. I hope this issue not only aids the practicing radiologist in revisiting topics in pediatrics, but also piques the interest of our readers in training to consider pediatric radiology as a subspecialty. It is a rewarding and challenging one!

We have chosen to review CNS anomalies as depicted on fetal MRI. This is a tireless topic presented in an up-to-date way. I hope it will improve understanding and aid in practice when a CNS anomaly comes your way, from prenatal sonographic anatomy screening to postnatal infant head imaging.

We also provide a review article on sonographic appearance of appendicitis, highlighting technique and expectations, as well as sonographic findings.

Cases provide discussion on a spectrum of examples encompassed in pediatric radiology, from musculoskeletal to gynecologic, from acquired to congenital. Our case reports highlight ovarian teratoma and craniopharyngioma, both classic examples of these entities. Viewbox summaries highlight a challenging case of vascular access, approached by our interventional radiologist and surgery team; a "pseudo mass" near the tongue, which was a cough drop in the mouth during the CT exam; as well as an example of Kienböck's disease.

I hope this issue will come to mind when you face examples we have discussed, and that it helps you in practice. I also hope that if you have not already decided on a subspecialty, you consider pediatric radiology.

**Wade Wong, DO, Receives ASSR Gold Medal**

In February 2016, at Annual Meeting of the American Society of Spine Radiology in Bonita Springs, FL, the Gold Medal was awarded to Wade Wong, DO, FACR, FAOCR. He is the ASSR's fourth Gold Medal Recipient and the first Interventionalist to receive the medal.

Dr. Wong was recognized for his teaching, for his innovations in Image Guided Interventions and for his leadership in bringing Pain Medicine into the auspices of Radiology. As of 2015, the American Board of Radiology now sponsors the CAQ in Pain Medicine.

Dr. Wong is a Past President of the ASSR, a Past President of the Western Neuroradiological Society, and a Past President of the AOOCR.

# 2016 Awards Recipients

## Trener Memorial Medal



**Sheri L. Albers, DO, FAOCR**, has been chosen to receive the 2016 Dr. Floyd J. Trener Memorial Medal for her outstanding service to the AOCR didactic educational programs.

Dr. Albers is currently the Director of Research for Radiology Research and Consultation. She is involved in device development for thrombectomy and for catheter development allowing the direct infusion of stem cells and fluids such as chemotherapy into solid organs. Non-device development projects include a research data base for bone marrow MR imaging.

Dr. Albers graduated from the University of North Texas Health Science Center in Fort Worth, TX. She completed her Internship at Metropolitan Hospital in Philadelphia, PA. She undertook her Diagnostic Radiology Residency and her Body Imaging Fellowship at the Medical Center of Delaware in Newark, DE. She also completed a Neuroradiology Fellowship at the University of California-Davis in Sacramento, CA, and an Interventional Pain Medicine Fellowship at the University of California – San Diego. Dr. Albers has been certified by both the AOBR and ABR in Diagnostic Radiology, and by the American Board of Interventional Pain Physicians.

She became an Active Member of the AOCR in 1998 and was awarded the title of Fellow of the AOCR in 2008. She has been a member of various committees including the Committee on Continuing Post Graduate Education, the Scientific Exhibits Committee, the Resident's Distance Learning Committee, and the Committee on Evaluation and Educational Standards. In addition, she has served on the AOCR Board of Directors since 2005.

Dr. Albers has presented numerous lectures at national specialty meetings including multiple AOCR- sponsored meetings. She is the Radiology Section Co-Editor for the journal, *Pain Physician*. She is a Board Member and Examiner for the American Board of Interventional Pain Physicians. She is an instructor for numerous national interventional and regenerative medicine workshops sponsored by the American Society of Interventional Pain Physicians. In addition, she has served as the Program Chair for both the 2005 and 2014 AOCR Mid-Year Conferences, and has been a mentor at many of the Mid-Year and Annual CME Activities.

Dr. Albers has written numerous peer-reviewed scientific papers, requested journal editorials and reviews, and has co-authored a number of book chapters.

The Dr. Floyd J. Trener Memorial Medal is one of the highest honors given to a member of the AOCR. The medal is given to a member who has been directly involved with the AOCR didactic educational programs and who is well respected by his or her peers. She will receive this honor at the AOCR Annual Awards Ceremony, April 20, 2016 in Austin, Texas.




