## Physical Exhibit

**Abstract** The Society for Women in Philosophy Collection (SWIP) dates from 1970-2013 and documents the society's origins and history as well as its organizational and interpersonal proceedings throughout the years. Materials include correspondence, newsletters, minutes, agendas, conference schedules, mailing lists, proposals, membership dues, financial documents, photographs, slides, a reel-to-reel tape, a cassette tape, and ephemera.

## Biographical/Historical note

---

The Society for Women in Philosophy is a grass-roots organization of feminist philosophers. An initial meeting under the name APA Women's Caucus took place at the December 1970 Eastern Division APA (American Philosophical Association) conference. They took the name Society for Women in Philosophy the following Spring at the Western Division APA conference. Their official history began in 1972. By the mid-1970s, regional SWIPs were organized throughout the U.S and in Canada. The UK, Germany, and the Netherlands are among its current international divisions. The journal *Hypatia: A Journal of Feminist Philosophy* was born out of SWIP in 1982.

SWIP was formed to help overcome sexist practices within the profession and to promote and support feminist philosophical scholarship. Each division conducts conferences and/or meetings with a set program of presented papers and workshops. SWIP and its accomplished members have been integral to introducing and sustaining feminist dialogues and approaches to philosophy in the US and beyond.

## Scope and Contents note

---

This collection is comprised of materials from seventeen donors. Together their contributions document the activities of the Eastern, Midwest, New York, and Pacific divisions of SWIP from 1970 through 2013. The bulk of materials cover 1971 through 1985. The collection is primarily comprised of agendas, conference papers and programs, correspondence, calls for papers, financial records, mailing lists, membership dues, memos, minutes, newsletters, notes, proposals. Subseries are arranged by their basic function or medium.

Subseries are primarily comprised of Business, Conferences, Correspondence, Employment, Ephemera, Finances, Membership, Newsletters, Photographs, and Slides. Business contains agendas, minutes, reports, and notes from committee meetings. Conferences contains program schedules, proposals, and papers presented at conferences.

Employment contains documents relating to the society's efforts to create employment opportunities for women in philosophy via directories and hiring guides. Membership contains dues and mailing lists.

There are also a few subject subseries in the collection. These include documents relating to the creation of the 10th anniversary video, the passing of Eunice Belgum, and the journal, *Hypatia*.

Also present are slides, photographs, a reel-to-reel tape of a 1976 meeting, a cassette tape labeled "Feminist Theorizing and Ethnocentrism", and ephemera in the form of SWIP pins and a stamp.

The materials of each donor are assigned to the SWIP division they were member of. In an effort to keep the papers as they were originally arranged, there are instances of papers from other divisions in some folders.

## Arrangement note

---

The collection is arranged into six main series:

Series 1. Formation of SWIP: This series is comprised of materials from the society's formative years. Dates range from 1970-1972.

Series 2. National SWIP: Since SWIP operates out of its various branches, 'National SWIP' refers to materials that involve multiple SWIP divisions. Subseries include Employment, Finances, Membership, and Newsletters. Dates range from 1973-2004.

Series 3. Eastern SWIP: This series is comprised of materials pertaining to the Eastern Division of SWIP. Subseries include 10th anniversary video, Business, Conferences, Correspondence, Employment, Ephemera, Eunice Belgum, Finances, Hypatia, Membership, Miscellaneous notes, Newsletters, Photographs, and Slides. Dates range from 1972-2009.

Series 4. Midwest SWIP: This series is comprised of materials pertaining to the Midwest Division of SWIP. Subseries include Business, Conferences, Correspondence, Digital photographs, Employment, Feminist Philosophy Reader, Hypatia, Newsletters, and Notes. Dates range from 1973-2013.

Series 5. NY SWIP: This series is comprised of materials pertaining to the New York Division of SWIP. Subseries include Business, Correspondence, Compiled material for Linda McAllister, Conferences, Newsletters, and Photographs. Dates range from 1994-2013.

Series 6. Pacific SWIP: This series is comprised of materials pertaining to the Pacific Division of SWIP. Subseries include Business, Conferences, Correspondence, Membership, and Newsletters. Dates range from 1975-2003.

Dear Hilde and Charlotte,

We write to explore the possibility of the CSW taking a liaison role with the SWIP Archive that our team got set up in the Feminist Theory Archive in the Brown University Library. Let us explain our thinking.

First, the Archive. We won't here go into the history of this project, though we are happy to answer any and all questions about it that you might have. You can check it out on the Feminist Theory Archive of the Pembroke Center website under "SWIP Donors". Our archivist at Brown has just finished up supervising the initial processing of the materials that have been donated to the Archive. She also set up on-line and physical exhibits of the Archive that have been available this past 6 months. This was all done by a temporary Assistant Archivist supervised by our Brown archivist, and funded by an APA \$5000 mini-grant. Attached is her concluding report on this part of the project along with the "Guide" to the collection that the Archivist produced.

The Archive contains the records of a philosophy organization focused on the careers and professional needs of women philosophers that has itself generated virtually every other women's philosophy institution in the U.S., and has stimulated the development of similar organizations in Canada, the U.K., Germany, and probably many other countries, plus the international feminist philosophy organization, IAPH. *Hypatia* was initially conceptualized at its meetings. And, so were virtually all of the other feminist philosophy organizations, from FEAST and FEMMSS, to the other dozen or so which flourish today. FEAST and FEMMSS have huge attendance. They have outreach into social science disciplines and, in the case of FEMMSS, the natural sciences. (The NSF Philosophy of Science grant officer regularly attends FEMMSS.)

SWIP has been an important player in all this generation of feminist activity because SWIP has been the one feminist philosophy organization whose meetings most feminist philosophers attend at some point or other, and many attend annually for decades. And the "local" meetings (that is, in addition to those held at the APA conferences) always include lots of socializing and strategizing about needed actions, in addition to the conventional presentations of papers. We gratefully remember the model job interviews SWIP meetings regularly provided for grad students, the practice sessions on how to ask questions at a philosophy conference, and SWIPs' successful insistence on transforming the APA's hiring policies and practices and journal review procedures: SWIP was responsible for insisting that job interviews occur in hotel sites that did not feature beds (!), that jobs be openly advertised instead of recruited through buddies at elite departments, and for introducing double-blind article reviewing. These meetings have always been valuable for introducing graduate students into feminist philosophical professionalism, and undergrads to the living, breathing authors of the essays they have been assigned. It has actively recruited women and at least a few of the men who will be their colleagues into feminist forms of professionalism. Perhaps most importantly, it has provided a supportive professional community

to philosophers who are all too often still the only woman and/or feminist in their departments. Thus the SWIP Archive contains the records of the first and continuingly important philosophy organization concerned to develop the wide range of resources needed to advance the professional lives of women in philosophy.

The Liaison Challenge. While the SWIP Archive is unusual and especially valuable in that it contains records of the early days, and hopefully of the continuing activities, of a huge disciplinary women's organization, this organization is highly dispersed, occasionally discontinuous, and completely grass-roots. These last three characteristics have made it difficult to set up on-going liaison relations between the various divisions and the Archive. There is no over-arching national SWIP. Local officers come and go. There is no single building where records are stored. Divisions and sub-divisions go in and out of existence. The first drive for Archive donations focused on the three regional SWIPs that correspond to the APA tri-partite structure. But there are additional lively ones, such as the one in New York City and also our Los Angeles division. There was one in the Houston area at one point, and probably a number of others have come and gone.

Our team managed to gather in a splendid collection of early records. But some kind of continuing liason is needed between a stabilized philosophy institution and the Archive. We propose that liason be assigned to one member of the CSW for her entire term. There are only two tasks that we can imagine that liason needing to do: 1) receive an annual report from the Archive on its new donations during the year, and deposit that report in the CSW files; 2) send out an annual request to all the locatable SWIP divisions reminding the Chair of each to send to the archive records of the division's activities for the year, and to encourage members to donate whatever relevant materials they may have. This last could be the e-mailed announcements of programs, and whatever else the division Chair wants to send.
