Steven Jonas is Professor of Preventive Medicine, School of Medicine; Professor, Graduate Program in Public Health; and Senior Research Fellow, Center for Health Services and Outcomes Research; all at Stony Brook University, Stony Brook, NY. He holds a BA from Columbia College (1958), an MD from the Harvard Medical School (1962), an MPH from the Yale School of Medicine (1967), and an MS in Health Management from the Wagner School of New York University (1997). He has also studied at the London School of Economics and the Touro College Law Center. He took his residency in Preventive Medicine/Public Health in the New York City Department of Health. He is a Past-President of the Association of Teachers of Preventive Medicine.



He has authored ten books of his own. Dr. Jonas has collaborated on 14 books. On health policy, preventive medicine and public health, and drug abuse policy, Dr. Jonas has published over 135 professional articles, book chapters, and book reviews, and has delivered well over 100 papers at conferences and seminars. He was a designated speaker on behalf of the National Health Care Campaign for the Clinton Health Plan in 1994. In addition, he has published numerous articles in the lay press, primarily on exercise and sports, and for both lay and professional audiences has given many talks on various aspects of health, fitness, and wellness. Further, on these topics he has had regular columns in several national publications (one currently), both lay and professional.
