The Department of Finance in the Fowler College of Business at San Diego State University (<http://www.sdsu.edu>) is seeking applicants for an open-rank tenure-track position in Real Estate, to begin Fall 2019. This position is contingent upon state funding). Qualified applicants will have a doctoral-level [PhD] degree in real estate or a related discipline with a record of teaching excellence and high-quality scholarship. They are also expected to interact effectively with members of the business community.

Qualified applicants must have a record of teaching excellence and high-quality scholarship, as evidenced by a portfolio of research activities, including publications in appropriate high-ranking real estate or related journals. They will also demonstrate a strong commitment and ability to teaching real estate and finance subjects at the undergraduate and graduate (MBA) levels.

The SDSU Fowler College of Business is among the nation's oldest and largest AACSB accredited business schools. Its accomplished faculty and highly ranked academic programs provide an exceptional foundation for an institution with significant regional, national and international impact. The Fowler College of Business enrolls approximately 5,500 undergraduate and about 500 graduate students.
