IMPORTANT FEEDBACK RECEIVED FROM SACAP (Council)

Invitation : Council Advisory Committees:

The council intends to establish small advisory committees in each region (± 3 persons) for the purpose of giving advise to clients / members of the public in connection with contractual problems, as well as to give advice where disputes arise between client and architect and if approached, also be prepared to advise architects; ' to act as an ombudsman capacity'.

The council have confirmed that no remuneration for telephonic advice is contemplated; but if more substantial intervention in a dispute is required then there could be an arrangement for payment with the person requesting the advise. In most cases the enquiry will come to the council and they will then pass it on to a regional committee or individual. 

[CHANGES TO THE CPD SYSTEM](#)

A number of amendments to the CPD system were made by the SA Council for the Quantity Surveying Profession on 28 March 2003.

The most important amendments are:

+ *Points shall be calculated over a 5-year "rolling" period. For example, at the end of year 6, year 1 shall be discarded and year 6 incorporated giving a total for years 2 - 6*

Due to a concession granted by the Council, the inaugural period from 1 January 1999 to 31 December 2005 is effectively a 6 year period. Therefore, in year 7, years 1 + 2 (1999 and 2000) shall fall away as "year 1"

The minimum points for each year shall be 25 and the minimum for any 5-year period shall be 200

+ *Annual submissions in respect of a 12-month period commencing on 1 January and ending on 31 December each year*

Quantity surveyors will be required to submit documentation on the enclosed form to the QS EduTech Centre annually not later than 28 February each year for the preceding year

AG

This is one of the most useful South African words. Pronounced like the "ach" in the German "achtung" it can be used to start a reply when you are asked a tricky question, as in "Ag, I don't know." PROMOTION OF ACCESS TO INFORMATION ACT

All quantity surveying firms practicing in South Africa need to comply with this act by the **31st August 2003**. We have published a guide to the Act in our CUG. The guide will assist you in the preparation of your Section 51 manuals and we also have a link to the manual of a quantity surveying practice who have already submitted their document to the South African Human Rights Commission.

PROBLEMS BELOW GROUND

On most construction projects it is common practice for the employer to arrange usually through the agency of the Architect or Engineer to commission a subsoil survey. In the absence of the results of such a survey it would be difficult to undertake the design with any certainty as to the loadings which could be carried by the subsoil. Once work started if at design stage there was no accurate knowledge of the subsoil conditions a redesign is always a distinct possibility. A reputable specialist is usually appointed to carry out the subsoil survey which is then used in the design process. The survey also proves useful to the contractor in pricing the work as it provides important information as to the likely conditions expected to be encountered. Most subsoil surveys comprise boreholes taken at regular intervals across the site. The closer the boreholes the more accurate the results. However it is often a balance, as the more boreholes there are the more costly the exercise. It is common practice for the tender enquiry documents to include the subsoil survey which is then used by the contractor when preparing the tender. Life is rarely simple and once work commences on site it often becomes clear that the ground conditions encountered are in many respects different from what could be anticipated from a careful inspection of the borehole survey. Delay and extra cost often results leaving the contractor facing contract over-runs and financial losses. A natural reaction is for the contractor to claim that as the employer has provided the borehole information there should without question be an entitlement to an extension of time and reimbursement of the financial losses.
