Directing Program Debut Panel

The **Directing Program (DP)** is searching for submissions for our **Debut Panel** at the 2020 ATHE Conference in Detroit, Michigan. We encourage applicants to **submit exercises, demonstrations, and/or traditional papers as scholarship**. The chosen presenter(s) for the 2020 DP Debut Panel will receive a small monetary award to offset the cost of conference attendance, pending funding approval.

Faculty, graduate students, and other teaching directors in higher education who have not yet presented at an ATHE conference are eligible to participate in the Debut Panel. Two or three presentations (of no more than 20 minutes each) will be selected through a rigorous juried review process. Time will be allotted for discussion and feedback.

Additionally, we are currently developing a one-on-one mentorship program to take place during the summer, in preparation for the conference panel. Past debut panel presenters have found these mentorships to be a highlight of their conference experience.
