

# Governor's Action Update

**Budget Action**: on Friday, March 16, 2018 <u>Governor Scott signed into law the General Appropriations</u>
Act. Included in this letter are his line-item vetoes, shown below in red.

**Opioid Bill**: today, <u>Governor Scott signed HB 21 Controlled Substances</u>. The bill will help limit the chance of drug addiction, reduce the ability for dangerous drugs to spread in Florida's communities and give vulnerable Floridians needed support by:

- Placing a three-day limit on prescribed opioids for acute pain, unless strict conditions are met for a seven-day supply;
- Requiring healthcare prescribers or dispensers of opioids to consult the Florida Prescription Drug
  Monitoring Program, a statewide database that monitors controlled substance prescriptions, to review
  a patient's medication history prior to prescribing or dispensing a controlled substance;
- Requiring continuing education courses for healthcare practitioners on responsibly prescribing opioids;
- Increasing penalties for healthcare practitioners that provide medically unnecessary controlled substance to a patient by fraud, misrepresentation, or other deception; and
- Implementing additional reforms to fight unlicensed pain management clinics.

Tax Incentives	On Sunday afternoon, the House and Senate reconvened to vote on the
	budget and associated bills as well as the tax package. HB 7087 is the tax
	package totals \$331 million and has two components:

#### \$150,000

From the funds in Specific Appropriation 457A, \$150,000 in nonrecurring funds from the General Revenue Fund is provided for the Coalition for Medicinal Cannabis Research within the Moffitt Cancer Center to conduct medical cannabis research pursuant to section 1004.4351, Florida Statutes. Veto message: "the funding is duplicative of funds that will be provided by the Department of Health, pursuant to s.381.986(8)(b), Florida Statutes. (Pg. 32 of Governor's Budget Review Letter)

Funds in Specific Appropriation 458A are provided for the **Live Like Bella** Initiative pursuant to section 381.922(2)(c), Florida Statutes, to advance progress toward curing pediatric cancer.

University of Miami Miller School of Medicine - Florida Stroke Registry (HB 3243)(Senate Form 1403)

### \$2 million

The nonrecurring funds provided in Specific Appropriation 2361A shall be transferred to the University of Miami- Sylvester Comprehensive Cancer Center for the purpose of Firefighter Cancer Research. The funds shall be utilized to: expand firefighters access to cancer screenings across the state; enable prevention and earlier detection of the disease; identify exposures that account for increased cancer risk; and field test new technology and methods that measure exposure in the field. The University of Miami - Sylvester Comprehensive Cancer Center shall develop a report on cancer research outcomes and cancer mitigation efforts being examined. The report shall be submitted to the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the Chief Financial Officer, and the Governor by June 15, 2019 (HB 2915) (Senate Form 2407).
