Background

The 2019 Canadian Pain Society (CPS) Annual Scientific Meeting will create a forum in which scientists, healthcare professionals, patients, and trainees from clinical, educational, research, policy, industry and other settings can meet and exchange up-to-date information on pain mechanisms, assessment, and management. The Scientific Program Committee (SPC) seeks to offer a balanced and diverse scientific program that reflects different areas of science from all members of the pain community.

Remuneration

The CPS does not provide any remuneration for accepted Symposia or Poster abstracts. All speakers are responsible for their own travel, accommodation and registration costs. Any author that has an accepted poster or symposium is required to register and pay to attend the meeting, for at least the day of their presentation.

Submission Guidelines

All abstract submissions are only accepted through the CPS website. Once submitted the author will be directed to a webpage thanking and confirming receipt of their proposed abstract(s). The submitting author will receive notification of acceptance of their abstract(s) once reviewed by the Scientific Program Committee.

Canadian Journal of Pain

Accepted abstracts will be printed in the online *Canadian Journal of Pain*, published by Taylor and Francis, and will be available for online viewing at the 2019 Annual Scientific Meeting. If any of the requested information is missing on the abstract templates, the Journal may not consider your abstract for publication.

Trainee Poster and Trainee Travel Awards

[CPS Trainee Members](#) who are the first/presenting author of a submitted poster abstract are eligible to submit their abstracts into the poster competition that will take place onsite at the Scientific Meeting. They may also be considered for a Trainee Travel Award. To be considered for a poster or travel award, opt-in on the online submission portal.

Hot Topics and Poster Pitches

All submitting poster abstract authors (CPS Members and Non-Members) are eligible to submit their abstracts for consideration to be selected for inclusion in special symposia or oral presentations (i.e., Hot Topics, Poster Pitches). To submit your poster abstract for consideration, opt-in on the online submission portal. Finalists will be selected by the SPC and will be notified of their inclusion prior to the Scientific Meeting.



RESEARCH POSTER ABSTRACTS | DEADLINE: NOVEMBER 21st, 2018

Description:

Posters can include summaries of the results of any research study (quantitative or qualitative) in the area of pain. While the results of pilot studies and abstracts with preliminary results will be considered, abstracts without any data and/or proposals will generally not be deemed suitable for acceptance.

Description:

These sessions are intended to address issues in clinical practice, basic or translational science, and/or public policy. Priority for acceptance will be given to multidisciplinary proposals (e.g. including within the session two or more presentations each of which represents a different clinical discipline and/or basic science) in accordance with the CPS mission. We strongly encourage submitters to consider integrating patients as speakers in symposia. Symposia will be normally 75 - 90 minutes in length and should be interactive and encourage audience participation when possible. Symposia will have no more than three speakers and a chair. The symposium Chair may be one of the three speakers or a fourth individual may act as chair. Symposium presenters can be clinicians, researchers, patients, or trainees (although generally there should be no more than one trainee per symposium). Symposia should typically integrate work from multiple labs/clinics/institutions.
