The CPO/SMD dyad will also enrich strong, collaborative relationships between CancerControl and various stakeholders, including the Alberta Cancer Foundation, the Cancer Strategic Clinical Network, the Canadian Association of Provincial Cancer Agencies, and the Canadian Partnership Against Cancer. The successful candidate will bring a strong and experienced clinical voice to the

This role will require collaboration with various internal and external stakeholders to ensure an integrated approach to providing services, fulfilling Cancer Care's clinical, research and educational goals.
