Michael has been monitoring the abundance and survival of Whistler black bears for 25 years including following the habits of black and grizzly bears in the Squamish and Whistler area. Michael will share stories and photos of these magnificent animals from the surrounding areas.

	The first morning session with Michael Marks from Indian River is designed for those firms that are playing the game to win rather than simply playing not to lose. In 2005 Michael helped our industry develop and agree to the top ten best and worst trading practices between manufacturers and distributors. The real issue today is that we are in the transition from the industrial age to the digital age and we are the ones in the middle.
