## Subject: Zero Emission Building Plan.

Dear Mr. Mayor,

Canadian Institute of Plumbing and Heating (CIPH), the trade association representing major plumbing, space, and water heating manufacturers in North America is deeply concerned by the lack of meaningful consultation led by Ecolighten on behalf of the city of Vancouver when plans were being drawn up to eliminate carbon emissions.

Ecolighten during their consultation process has erroneously overlooked the facts that there are multiple other technologies currently existing or being developed and soon to be introduced into the marketplace that will address the needs of the City of Vancouver's population in space and water heating while limiting the effects on the city's infrastructure.

CIPH and our industry members work diligently to provide safe, efficient, environmentally sensitive products for the marketplace. It is our recommendation that the City of Vancouver defer the January 1, 2022 roll out for a minimum of 18 to 24 months allowing the city and industry time to work together to provide the solutions that will lead to create the leading clean, affordable city while avoiding any unintended consequences and consumer backlash.
